



En el evangelio que escuchamos, Jesús se presenta como el Buen Pastor, y él mismo explica que el Buen Pastor da la vida por sus ovejas. No es difícil entender, que, si Jesús es el Pastor, pues nosotros somos las ovejas, esta analogía es muy hermosa, y aun así recuerdo que hubo una ocasión que cuando la leía me costaba un poco de incomodidad, el pensar que Jesús me comparara con una oveja. Pensemos en esto:

La oveja es un animal que depende del cuidado del pastor, pues la lana le puede crecer tanto, que le puede impedir incluso el caminar, comer y ni se diga el ver.

La oveja también depende del pastor en su cuidado, pues al tener lana, es muy posible que muchos insectos y parásitos entren a la piel la lastimen o que incluso dañen su torrente sanguíneo provocándole enfermedades y muerte, entonces el pastor para evitar eso, tiene que estarla ungiendo con aceites aromáticos que le funcionaran como repelentes.

Para comer, pues la oveja no tiene buena vista, es incapaz de poder encontrar verdes campos o agua, así que también para encontrar comida necesita del pastor.





The essential rite of Confirmation is anointing the forehead of the baptized with sacred chrism (in the East other sense-organs as well), together with the laying on of the minister's hand and the words: "Accipe signaculum doni Spiritus Sancti" (Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit.) in the Roman Rite, or "The seal of the gift that is the Holy Spirit" in the Byzantine rite. The Effects of Confirmation

It is evident from its celebration that the effect of the sacrament of Confirmation is the full outpouring of the Holy Spirit as once granted to the apostles on the day of Pentecost.

From this fact, Confirmation brings an increase and deepening of baptismal grace:

- it roots us more deeply in the divine filiation which makes us cry, "Abba! Father!";
- it unites us more firmly to Christ;
- it increases the gifts of the Holy Spirit in us;
- it renders our bond with the Church more perfect;
- it gives us a special strength of the Holy Spirit to spread and defend the faith by word and action as true witnesses of Christ, to confess the name of Christ boldly, and never to be ashamed of the Cross: Recall then that

you have received the spiritual seal, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of right judgment and courage, the spirit of

knowledge and reverence, the spirit of holy fear in God's presence. Guard what you have received. God the Father has marked you with his sign; Christ the Lord has confirmed you and has placed his pledge, the Spirit, in your hearts.

Like Baptism which it completes, Confirmation is given only once, for it too imprints on the soul an indelible spiritual mark, the "character," which is the sign that Jesus Christ has marked a Christian with the seal of his Spirit by clothing him with power from on high so that he may be his witness. This "character" perfects the common priesthood of the faithful, received in Baptism, and "the confirmed person receives the power to profess faith in Christ publicly and as it were officially."





Our Mission

t is not difficult to know what our mission is, since it is the very mission of the Church. This mission is expressed in Sacred Scripture, especially in the Gospels.

"Jesus approached them and spoke thus: "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, then, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you all the days until the end of the world" (MT 28: 18-20).

This mission entrusted directly to the Apostles, today to the Bishops, extends to all baptized people. What we have received, we have to announce. Since I became aware of my being a Christian, I have assumed this task as my own. I have embraced it even more closely since being ordained a priest, and I rejoice that my bishop, Bishop Joe Vázquez, has directly entrusted to me this same ministry to be performed here in our parish.

That is why I state the mission this way:

"In unity with our Diocesan Church of Austin, following the

guidelines issued by our bishop, we seek to EVANGELIZE, MAKE DISCIPLES, and FORM THE CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY."

EVANGELIZATION seeks to provoke the encounter with a God lived and real, through the basic preaching of the Kerygma (Greek for "proclamation" and refers to the Gospel) and prayer. This will take place through initiatives of the pastoral groups and others in the parish.

MAKING DISCIPLES is, undoubtedly, the most difficult task, since it consists in making Jesus the teacher in our lives and learning from Him how to live His teaching faithfully in every area of our life. This we will aim for through a continuous catechesis. The parish seeks to be a place of growth in faith.

FORM THE CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY This goal is the natural fruit of living a personal encounter with God and seeking His kingdom in our lives. We cannot live our faith alone. Rather, we need a community where we can share our experiences and nourish ourselves with the testimony of other brothers and sisters in Christ. St. Mary Immaculate Concepción wants to be a place where faith is lived. We intentionally live this way in the Liturgical assembly, in the ministry and service groups and in our own moments of coexistence and spirituality, koinonia (Christian fellowship or communion) and mystagogy (led through the mysteries of faith).

We are a church on the move that is renewed in the love of God and guided by the prompting of the Holy Spirit.


Somos una iglesia en movimiento que se renueva en el amor de Dios y es guiada por el impulso del Espíritu Santo.

I know that sometimes I am worse at this than anybody. My mind often flies with too many things to do. I often block out everything around me as I scamper from one task to another. Perhaps you do this too. You might be on the run and totally oblivious to a neighbor who is rather down in the dumps. Or you might be so caught up in the hectic schedule that your kids have, bringing this one to baseball, that one to karate, dance, school meetings, etc., that you might not notice that one of your children has needs far greater than all the activities you provide for him or her. Following the Good Shepherd requires our never being too busy to be aware of and to respond to those around us who need help.

The Good Shepherd is the Risen Lord. He is with us. He will never leave us alone. Today we ask this Lord to allow us to slow down and hear his voice.






