The importance of not forgetting the beginning.



Today, we reflect on the topic of divorce in light of the Gospel. Some of you might think you've heard everything there is to know about divorce, or perhaps it doesn't concern you if you're single or not planning to marry. However, Jesus' teachings always have something to offer everyone, whether you're married, single, or considering a family. Jesus calls us to open our hearts, set aside our preconceived ideas, and truly understand His message.

In this Gospel passage, Jesus responds to a Pharisee's question about whether divorce is lawful. The Pharisees, experts in the law, knew all the legal details. Yet, Jesus points out that they miss the spirit of the law. Moses permitted divorce due to the hardness of people's hearts, but Jesus reminds us that this was never God's intention. From the very beginning, marriage was designed as a union of love, a love that does not expire.

Divorce is not a solution to the challenges within marriage. When a couple chooses divorce, they essentially close the door to any possibility of reconciliation or healing. Jesus teaches us that divorce is like the "death" of the relationship, cutting off the hope of renewing the bond. However, the true issue lies not in the act of divorce, but in allowing the love that once existed to fade and die through neglect. Love, like anything living, must be nurtured and fed to survive.

Jesus takes us back to the heart of marriage: love. He asks us whether love has an expiration date, whether it is something that should dissolve over time. The

true challenge is to keep love alive and growing, to nourish it with daily care. Just as we need food to sustain our bodies, relationships need constant attention and effort. Love doesn't simply disappear — we allow it to wither when we fail to nurture it.

In this reflection, Jesus warns that what truly destroys marriage is not infidelity or financial struggles, but indifference. When we stop enjoying one another's company and fail to nurture our connection, the relationship begins to fall apart. The real challenge is to fight for love daily, for the shared dream. You may argue with your spouse for an hour, but if the remaining 23 hours are filled with love, understanding, and compassion, your marriage will remain strong. It is when that one hour of conflict overshadows everything else that the relationship is at risk.

Jesus invites us to remember what brought two people together in the first place, to rekindle that love and fight for it. Love does not run out; rather, it is something we allow to die if we do not fight to keep it alive. Today's message calls us not only to feed the love in our relationships but also to nourish our dreams and goals. God, who is love, calls us to never give up, to keep fighting for what truly matters. May the Lord bless our lives and relationships, helping us always seek to nourish love within our families.

La importancia de no olvidar el principio



Hoy reflexionamos sobre el tema del divorcio a la luz del Evangelio. Algunos pueden pensar que ya lo han escuchado todo sobre este tema o que no les afecta si están solteros o no planean casarse. Sin embargo, las enseñanzas de Jesús siempre tienen algo nuevo que decirnos a todos, ya sea que estemos casados, solteros, o pensando en formar una familia. Jesús nos invita a abrir nuestro corazón y a dejar de lado los prejuicios, para entender lo que Él realmente quiere enseñarnos.

En este Evangelio, Jesús responde a un fariseo que le pregunta si es lícito el divorcio. Sabemos que los fariseos eran expertos en la ley, conocían cada detalle, pero Jesús les muestra que les falta algo esencial: el espíritu de la ley. Moisés permitió el divorcio debido a la dureza de corazón del pueblo, pero desde el principio no era así. Jesús nos recuerda que el matrimonio fue diseñado por Dios como una unión de amor, y que este amor no tiene fecha de caducidad.

El divorcio no es una solución para los problemas del matrimonio. Cuando una pareja opta por el divorcio, está matando cualquier posibilidad de reconciliación o de reavivar el amor. El divorcio no es más que el "homicidio" de una relación, porque destruye toda esperanza de reconstrucción. Jesús nos enseña que el verdadero problema no es el divorcio en sí, sino la falta de amor y de esfuerzo por mantener viva la relación. Si el amor no se alimenta, muere.

Jesús nos lleva al origen del matrimonio: el amor. Y nos pregunta, ¿acaso el amor tiene fecha de vencimiento? ¿Acaso el amor debe apagarse? El

verdadero desafío es nutrir ese amor, alimentarlo con pequeños gestos, con dedicación diaria. Así como necesitamos alimento para nuestro cuerpo, también nuestras relaciones necesitan ser cuidadas y nutridas. El amor no es algo que se pierde, es algo que dejamos morir si no lo cuidamos.

En esta reflexión, Jesús nos advierte que lo que realmente destruye el matrimonio no son las traiciones, ni los problemas financieros, sino la indiferencia. Cuando dejamos de disfrutar la compañía del otro, cuando dejamos de alimentar el amor, es cuando la relación comienza a deteriorarse. El verdadero desafío está en pelear cada día por ese amor, por ese sueño compartido. Si peleas con tu pareja una hora, pero las otras 23 horas se aman, su relación seguirá viva. Pero si esa hora de pelea consume toda la relación, entonces el matrimonio está en peligro.

Jesús nos invita a recordar el amor que unió a dos personas en primer lugar, a revivir esa llama y a luchar por ella. El amor no se acaba, lo matamos cuando dejamos de luchar por él. Hoy es una invitación a alimentar no solo el amor en nuestras relaciones, sino también nuestros sueños, nuestras metas. Dios, que es amor, nos llama a no rendirnos, a pelear por lo que realmente vale la pena.

The Role of the Church in American Political Life



The Church is the body of Christ, who reigns as king over all Creation. Everything, including political life, belongs to Jesus Christ, and so participation in political life belongs to the mission of the Church. Our mandate is to ‘go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation’ (Mk 16:15). . . . Here, ‘the creation’ refers to every aspect of human life. . . ‘Nothing human can be alien to it.’

Pope Francis, *Evangelii Gaudium*, no. 181, quoting *Aparecida Document*, no. 380

Our national tradition of religious freedom permits and encourages all people of faith to bring the insights of their religious traditions to bear on political matters. As Pope Francis affirmed during his visit to the U.S., “Religious liberty, by its nature, transcends places of worship and the private sphere of individuals and families. . . . Religion itself, the religious dimension, is not a subculture; it is part of the culture of every people and every nation.”¹

“If society is to have a future, it must respect the truth of our human dignity and submit to that truth. . . . A society is noble and decent not least for its support of the pursuit of truth and its adherence to the most

basic of truths” (*Fratelli Tutti*, no. 207). The truths that guide public life can be known by natural reason. The sanctity of human life, the equal dignity of all individuals, the obligation to protect the vulnerable, the nature and purposes of sex, marriage, and family—these are not exclusively “religious” truths, but truths that all people of goodwill can come to know without the aid of revelation. Our Catholic faith sheds light on these truths, and so we have a duty to bring that light to our nation.

Many Parts, All One Body

The bishops and their pastoral collaborators each have distinct roles in the Church’s mission. The bishops have the responsibility to govern the society of the Church, hand

on doctrine and tradition, and administer the sacraments. The laity are called to bring the gospel to bear on the world. While many laity are involved in roles of leadership and service within the Church, it remains primarily the role of the laity to advocate for justice, to serve in public office, and to inform daily life with the gospel. “The direct duty to work for a just ordering of society is proper to the lay faithful” (*Deus Caritas Est*, no. 29).

Participation in political life requires judgments about concrete circumstances. While bishops together with their coworkers help form the laity in accordance with basic principles, they do not tell the laity to vote for particular candidates. On these often complex matters, it is the laity’s responsibility to form their consciences and grow in the virtue of prudence to approach the many and varied issues of the day with the mind of Christ.

Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship

Conscience is “a judgment of reason” by which one determines whether an action is right or wrong (see *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 1778). It does not allow us to justify doing whatever we want, nor is it a mere “feeling.” Conscience—properly formed according to God’s revelation and the teaching of the Church—is a means by which one listens to God and discerns how to act in accordance with the truth.² The truth is something we receive, not something we make. We can only judge using the conscience we have, but our judgments do not make things true.

It is our responsibility to learn more of Catholic teaching and tradition, to participate in Church life, to learn from trustworthy sources about the issues facing our communities, and to do our best to make wise judgments about candidates and government actions. These decisions should take into account a candidate’s commitments, character, integrity, and ability to influence a given issue. Thus equipped, and further impelled by our sense of patriotism, we exercise our right and duty to vote and otherwise to participate actively in public life.³ By forming our consciences for faithful citizenship, we can better pursue the common good and thus obey the command of our Lord to love our neighbors.

DEACON'S CORNER

In July of 1979 we were relocated to Texas by the company that I worked for at that time. And when we finally settled in our new home and were getting familiar with the area, I discovered a new vernacular – Texan language. It took awhile to get used to “fixing to,” “corn-fed” refers to size – not food, “Bless your heart” is not a benediction, “y’all and all y’all” and “Howdy” is the official greeting of Texas. Well, we have become Texanized since we have lived in Texas for over 45 years. But now a new Texan word has entered into my vocabulary. One that has been used quite often after I wrote in the “Deacon corner” a year ago in July. “I’m gonna” So I looked “gonna” up in the dictionary and “gonna” means “going to” in informal speech. Well, my friends I am tired of hearing this excuse. I am going to say the following for one last time. “Anyone who has suddenly been responsible for handling the details of a death where no pre-arrangements have been made knows the overwhelming number of decisions that are involved. At a time of loss, confusion reigns, you can feel pulled in many directions at once, especially if you are uncertain what the deceased wanted. Making your funeral arrangements in advance is one last wonderful gift you can give the loved ones who will be left behind. By freeing them from the burden of many details, you give them time to do the work of grieving and caring for one another. Meanwhile, the rites surrounding your funeral can be a statement of your values and the meaning you found in your life and death. Your parish, St. Mary Immaculate Conception, is here for you to help you pre-plan your journey home by providing, not only help at the office, but also by using our website at <https://brenhamcatholic.org/> . On the front page of the website is a tab that says “Funeral” and this tab leads you to a page that will help you to choose your scripture readings and hymns. We have also provided a form for you to fill in with your information to be saved by you and to send to us for safe keeping. After we receive your information, we will call you to gather other pertinent information. And of course, we can also meet with you in person to help you to prepare your wishes.

En julio de 1979, la empresa para la que trabajaba en ese momento nos trasladó a Texas. Y cuando finalmente nos instalamos en nuestro nuevo hogar y nos estábamos familiarizando con la zona, descubrí una nueva lengua vernácula: el idioma texano. Me llevó un tiempo acostumbrarme a “fixing to”, “corn-fed” se refiere al tamaño, no a la comida, “Bless your heart” no es una bendición, “y’all and all y’all” y “Howdy” es el saludo oficial de Texas. Bueno, nos hemos texanizado desde que vivimos en Texas durante más de 45 años. Pero ahora una nueva palabra texana he entrado en mi vocabulario. Una que se ha utilizado con bastante frecuencia después de que escribiera en el “rincón del diácono” hace un año en julio. “I’m gonna”. Así que busqué “gonna” en el diccionario y “gonna” significa “ir a” en el habla informal. Bueno, amigos míos, estoy cansado de escuchar esta excusa. Voy a decir lo siguiente por última vez. “Cualquiera que de repente haya sido responsable de manejar los detalles de una muerte sin arreglos previos sabe la abrumadora cantidad de decisiones que están involucradas. En un momento de pérdida, reina la confusión, puede sentirse atraído en muchas direcciones a la vez, especialmente si no está seguro de lo que quería el difunto. Hacer los arreglos funerarios con anticipación es un último regalo maravilloso que puede dar a los seres queridos que quedarán atrás. Al liberarlos de la carga de muchos detalles, les da tiempo para hacer el trabajo de duelo y cuidarse unos a otros. Mientras tanto, los ritos que rodean su funeral pueden ser una declaración de sus valores y el significado que encontró en su vida y muerte. Su parroquia, St. Mary Immaculate Conception, está aquí para ayudarlo a planificar con anticipación su viaje a casa brindándole, no solo ayuda en la oficina, sino también utilizando nuestro sitio web en <https://brenhamcatholic.org/>. En la página principal del sitio web hay una pestaña que dice “Funeral” y esta pestaña lo lleva a una página que lo ayudará a elegir sus lecturas de las Escrituras e himnos. También le proporcionamos un formulario para que lo complete con su información para que la guardemos y nos la envíe para que la guardemos de manera segura. Después de que recibamos su información, lo llamaremos para recopilar otra información pertinente. Y, por supuesto, también podemos reunirnos con usted en persona para ayudarlo a preparar sus deseos.
