

#### Introduction to Wisdom

The central theme of today's reflection is wisdom. Wisdom is distinct from memory and intelligence. While memory allows us to recall information and intelligence enables us to produce new ideas, wisdom goes further. It is about living a happy and fulfilling life. A wise person knows how to savor life, appreciating the best of everything. The Scriptures emphasize that wisdom is more valuable than wealth, health, or beauty because it brings lasting fulfillment and joy.

### Wisdom as a Divine Gift

In the first reading from the Book of Wisdom, the author describes how he asked for and received wisdom. He valued wisdom above all else, even above gold, silver, or health. This passage teaches us that true wisdom leads to happiness and contentment in life. The author acknowledges that with wisdom came numerous blessings, proving that a wise person, though possibly lacking in material wealth or perfect health, can still lead a joyful and meaningful life.

### Seeking Wisdom in Life

The reflection moves to a practical question: where can we find wisdom? In modern society, there are plenty of resources that teach memory techniques or how to enhance intelligence. But for wisdom, we must turn to something deeper—the Word of God. The Bible serves as a manual for living a wise and happy life. It teaches us how to live according to God's will, which is the key to true joy. The reflection emphasizes that reading and practicing the teachings of Scripture can spare us from many unnecessary struggles and mistakes.

#### The Power of God's Word

The second reading highlights the penetrating power of God's Word. It is described as being sharper than a two-edged sword, capable of discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart. The reflection points out that God's Word reveals the truth about our lives and provides the guidance we need to live in harmony with His will. It is through the Scriptures that we can understand God's plan for us—a plan that ultimately leads to happiness.

### The Gospel's Call to True Fulfillment

In the Gospel, we hear the story of a young man who approaches Jesus, eager to learn what he must do to inherit eternal life. Jesus, knowing the man's heart, instructs him to sell all his possessions and follow Him. The man leaves saddened because he cannot let go of his material wealth. The reflection underscores that true happiness and eternal life are found not in accumulating possessions, but in surrendering ourselves to God's will. Material things can enslave us, preventing us from experiencing the fullness of life that Jesus offers.

### **Choosing Freedom and Happiness**

The reflection concludes with a call to freedom. To truly follow Jesus and attain happiness, we must be willing to let go of anything that holds us back—whether material possessions, pride, or fear. Only when we are free from these attachments can we fully experience the joy that comes from a life lived in communion with God and in service to others. This is the essence of wisdom: the ability to discern what truly matters and to live a life that reflects God's love and purpose.

### Introducción a la Sabiduría

El tema central de la reflexión de hoy es la sabiduría. La sabiduría es diferente de la memoria y la inteligencia. Mientras que la memoria nos permite recordar información y la inteligencia nos ayuda a generar nuevas ideas, la sabiduría va más allá. La persona sabia sabe cómo vivir una vida feliz y plena. Sabe cómo disfrutar y "saborear" la vida. A través de la Escritura, se nos enseña que la sabiduría nos permite seleccionar lo mejor de lo bueno y vivir de una manera que nos trae verdadera felicidad.

### La Sabiduría como Don Divino

En la primera lectura del Libro de la Sabiduría, el autor describe cómo pidió la sabiduría y se le concedió. La consideró más valiosa que el oro, la plata e incluso la salud. Este pasaje nos enseña que la verdadera sabiduría conduce a la felicidad y a una vida plena. Con la sabiduría vienen innumerables bendiciones, demostrando que una persona sabia, aunque no tenga riquezas materiales o salud perfecta, puede llevar una vida llena de gozo.

### Buscar Sabiduría en la Vida

La reflexión plantea la pregunta práctica: ¿dónde podemos encontrar la sabiduría? Mientras que existen recursos para mejorar la memoria o la inteligencia, la verdadera sabiduría solo se puede encontrar en algo más profundo: la Palabra de Dios. La Biblia actúa como un manual para vivir con sabiduría y felicidad. En sus enseñanzas, encontramos las claves para evitar muchos problemas si la leemos y la ponemos en práctica. La sabiduría divina se encuentra en las Escrituras, que nos enseñan a vivir conforme a la voluntad de Dios.

### El Poder de la Palabra de Dios

La segunda lectura nos recuerda el poder de la

Palabra de Dios, que es más penetrante que una espada de dos filos, capaz de discernir los pensamientos y las intenciones del corazón. La reflexión destaca que la Palabra de Dios revela la verdad sobre nuestra vida y nos guía hacia la felicidad verdadera. Nos muestra el plan de Dios, cuyo propósito es que vivamos con alegría y plenitud, de acuerdo con Su voluntad.

## El Evangelio y el Llamado a la Verdadera Plenitud

El Evangelio cuenta la historia de un joven que se acerca a Jesús en busca de la vida eterna. Jesús, conociendo su corazón, le pide que venda todo lo que posee y lo siga. El joven se va triste porque no puede deshacerse de sus bienes. La reflexión nos enseña que la verdadera felicidad y la vida eterna no se encuentran en acumular riquezas materiales, sino en entregarnos completamente a Dios. Para ser felices, debemos liberarnos de los apegos que nos atan y vivir en libertad para amar y servir.

### Eligiendo la Libertad y la Felicidad

La reflexión concluye con un llamado a la libertad. Para seguir a Jesús y alcanzar la felicidad, debemos desprendernos de lo que nos ata, ya sean bienes materiales, orgullo o miedo. Solo siendo libres podemos experimentar la verdadera plenitud que Dios nos ofrece. La verdadera sabiduría está en elegir a Dios por encima de todo y en amar a los demás a través del servicio. Así, encontraremos el verdadero "sabor" de la vida y la felicidad duradera.

# Dignity of the Human Person



In their statement on Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, the Catholic bishops of the United States identify the four main principles of the Church's social teaching and apply them to some concrete issues. This is not to tell the faithful for whom or against whom to vote, but instead to help them form their consciences in accordance with God's truth as they approach this oftenchallenging decision. The four main principles are the Dignity of the Human Person, the Common Good, Solidarity, and Subsidiarity. They are all interrelated. This bulletin focuses on the Dignity of the Human Person, and the other three principles are covered in three other bulletins in this series.

Because each human person is created in the image and likeness of God, each one of us possesses innate and inviolable human dignity. This dignity is present in each person from the moment of their conception and throughout their lives. As Pope Francis has emphasized, human dignity is central to building a society in which we are "brothers and sisters all."

"The dignity of the human person is the foundation for a moral vision of society." Every human being has the right to live with dignity and to develop integrally; this fundamental right cannot be denied by any country. People have this right even if they are unproductive, or were born with or developed limitations. This does not detract from their great dignity as human persons, a dignity based not on circumstances but on the intrinsic worth of their being. Unless this basic principle is upheld, there will be no future either for fraternity or for the survival of humanity.<sup>2</sup>

The dignity of the human person is the foundation for a moral vision of society. As we seek to imitate the Good Samaritan and become neighbor to all, we must work to protect the dignity of all, especially those who are most vulnerable.

As we engage in the public square with a wellformed conscience:

• We work to protect the most vulnerable—children in the womb who are in danger of abortion—while also standing in radical solidarity with mothers.<sup>3</sup> Building on their bond of flesh and kinship, and on the network of family, neighbor, and community relationships in which they are situated, the Church actively assists mothers and their children to have a brighter future.

- We continue to protect the dignity of our sister or brother who is elderly, disabled, or ill by strongly rejecting euthanasia and assisted suicide. These practices are symptoms of a "throwaway culture," in which children of God of inestimable worth are cast aside as worthless.<sup>4</sup>
- Likewise, we must recognize the inherent dignity of the migrant and refugee. In our country now, that means comprehensive immigration reform that offers a path to citizenship, treats immigrant workers fairly, prevents the separation of families, maintains the integrity of our borders, respects the rule of law, and addresses the factors that compel people to leave their own countries.
- We support the dignity of the person, created male or female; therefore, we oppose a gender ideology that fails to recognize the difference and reciprocity between man and woman.<sup>5</sup>
- Racism attacks the dignity of the human person by denying that we are all equally made in the image of God, so we must overcome racism in our hearts as well as in our systems and institutions.<sup>6</sup>
- We continue to seek reform of the criminal justice system and to end the use of the death penalty. We support common sense measures to reduce gun violence.<sup>7</sup>
- Finally, we seek to prevent and remedy any aspects of an "economy of exclusion," which "does not hesitate to exploit, discard, and even kill human beings," and to work instead toward an "economy of communion" rooted in ethical concern.

"Social friendship and universal fraternity"
Pope Francis writes, "necessarily call for an acknowledgement of the worth of every human person, always and everywhere." Through our political participation, our accompaniment of those in need, and the witness of our daily lives, may we support the worth of every person, created in God's image.




It would not come as a surprise, as we are experiencing significant growth among Catholics in Brenham.



### DEACON'S CORNER

In my 21 plus years as an ordained Deacon I have been asked many questions about Faith, why's, what is a Deacon, my paycheck and what are my duties as a Deacon. I would like to address the question about duties and the definition of the word "duties."

Being a Deacon is not a job, it is a ministry. We are called to serve others as read for the first time from the Acts of the Apostles in Chapter six. St. Stephen and six other Faith filled men were ordained to minister to the widows. A ministry of service to God and others. That was the beginning of the diaconate in our church and our ministry to others has grown abundantly throughout the years.

"In Roman Catholicism, deacons are the link between the church and the world. They are men who, for the most part, are **married and hold full-time jobs** in the secular world. But they are also ordained clergy who perform every function in the church except consecrating the Eucharist, anointing of the sick and hearing confessions." Most Reverend Joe S. Vasquez bishop of the Diocese of Austin has granted to me and all of the Deacons of St. Mary Immaculate Conception the following faculties.

To Baptize children under the age of seven, To distribute the Body and Blood of Christ at Mass and outside of Mass, To exercise the office of Deacon in liturgical celebrations, To deliver the homily at Mass and to preach at other religious services, To preach the Gospel at Mass and to conduct Scripture Services, To administer the rite of the sacrament of Matrimony, To conduct vigil services at wakes and to preside at a funeral service.

Through all of these faculties we Deacons fulfill the link between the church and the world. You will see us facilitating scripture studies, visiting the sick and homebound, guiding our community in outreach to others, welcoming those who are seeking our Faith, quietly assisting our pastor and many other ways of being a service to our community.

Our paycheck consists of the many blessings we receive as we serve the needs of the church. And the many blessings we have received from God.

### RINCON DEL DIACONO

El Reverendísimo Joe S. Vasquez, obispo de la Diócesis de Austin, me ha concedido a mí y a todos los Diáconos de Santa María Inmaculada Concepción las siguientes facultades.

Bautizar a niños menores de siete años, Distribuir el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo en la Misa y fuera de ella, Ejercer el oficio de Diácono en las celebraciones litúrgicas, Pronunciar la homilía en la Misa y predicar en otros servicios religiosos, Predicar el Evangelio en la Misa y dirigir los Servicios Bíblicos, Administrar el rito del sacramento del Matrimonio, Dirigir los servicios de vigilia en los velorios y presidir un servicio fúnebre.

A través de todas estas facultades, los Diáconos cumplimos el vínculo entre la Iglesia y el mundo. Nos verá facilitando estudios de las Sagradas Escrituras, visitando a los enfermos y confinados en sus hogares, guiando a nuestra comunidad en la ayuda a los demás, dando la bienvenida a quienes buscan nuestra fe, ayudando silenciosamente a nuestro pastor y de muchas otras maneras de brindar servicio a nuestra comunidad.




