Jesus replied, "The first is this:
Hear, O Israel!.."**

The Question and Jesus' Answer

In this Gospel account, a question is posed to Jesus regarding the foremost commandment. Although His answer may initially seem to diverge from the question, it unveils a profound teaching. When asked about the primary commandment, Jesus does not mention merely one but includes love for one's neighbor, illustrating the inseparable nature of the two. This response reflects an invitation to grasp a holistic understanding of love that encompasses both God and others.

The Commandment to Love and Listen

Jesus responds that the principal commandment is "to love God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength," and that this love is also demonstrated through love for one's neighbor. However, the initial instruction is to "listen." This entails a disposition to open oneself to God and comprehend His will before taking action. Listening to God is essential, as we often attempt to interpret teachings according to our preferences. This initial step of "listening" truly connects us with the commandment of love.

Loving One's Neighbor, the Nearest

Jesus emphasizes that one's neighbor is not merely a distant individual or an abstract concept but rather the person who is near. This love is not confined to acts of compassion for those far away but encompasses those with whom we interact daily: colleagues, family members, and even the driver in traffic. Loving one's neighbor is a continual exercise

that extends beyond good intentions, becoming an active presence and understanding in one's immediate environment.

Practicing Love in the Christian Life

According to Jesus, love is a virtue that requires practice. Knowing the theory alone is insufficient; it must be lived day by day. Acts of mercy and gestures of kindness and patience are exercises that strengthen love, leading us to live an active faith. During special times such as Lent, this approach invites us to reflect on the extent to which we are truly practicing love, not only toward God but also toward our neighbor, as a direct reflection of our devotion.

The Depth of Loving with One's Entire Being

Jesus explains that true love must encompass the whole being, under all circumstances. To illustrate this, a monk uses the analogy of yearning for air while underwater to convey the intensity with which we must seek God. This profound and sincere desire allows us to fully live out the commandment of loving God and our neighbor. With an open and willing heart, love becomes a transformative experience that reflects the character of God in our daily lives.

Jesús le respondió:

La Pregunta y Respuesta de Jesús

En este relato del evangelio, se explora una pregunta que le hacen a Jesús sobre cuál es el mandamiento más importante. Aunque pareciera que responde de una forma que no se ajusta a la pregunta inicial, la respuesta de Jesús revela una enseñanza profunda. Al preguntarle por el primer mandamiento, Jesús no solo menciona uno, sino que incluye también el amor al prójimo, mostrando la inseparabilidad de ambos. Esta respuesta refleja una invitación a una comprensión integral del amor que abarca tanto a Dios como a los demás.

El Mandamiento de Amar y Escuchar

Jesús responde que el mandamiento principal es "amar a Dios con todo el corazón, alma, mente y fuerzas" y que este amor se manifiesta también en el prójimo. Sin embargo, antes de todo, la instrucción es "escuchar". Esto implica una disposición a abrirse a Dios y comprender su voluntad antes de actuar. Escuchar a Dios es esencial, ya que muchas veces podemos intentar interpretar las enseñanzas según nuestras preferencias. Este paso inicial de "escuchar" nos conecta verdaderamente con el mandato de amor.

Amar al Prójimo, el Próximo

Jesús enfatiza que el prójimo no es solo alguien lejano o un concepto abstracto, sino la persona cercana a nosotros. Este amor no se limita a actos de compasión por quienes están lejos, sino que abarca a aquellos con quienes interactuamos diariamente: el compañero de trabajo, la familia y hasta el conductor

en el tráfico. Amar al prójimo es un ejercicio constante que va más allá de buenas intenciones y se convierte en una acción de presencia y comprensión en el entorno cotidiano.

Practicar el Amor en la Vida Cristiana

El amor, según Jesús, es una virtud que necesita ser practicada. No basta con conocer la teoría; es esencial vivirla día a día. Las obras de misericordia y los gestos de bondad y paciencia son ejercicios que fortalecen el amor, llevándonos a vivir una fe activa. En tiempos especiales como la Cuaresma, este enfoque nos invita a reflexionar sobre cuánto estamos realmente practicando el amor, no solo hacia Dios, sino también hacia el prójimo, como un reflejo directo de nuestra devoción.

La Profundidad de Amar con Todo el Ser

Jesús explica que el amor verdadero debe abarcar todo el ser, en toda circunstancia. Para ilustrarlo, un monje utiliza la analogía de desear aire bajo el agua para describir la intensidad con la que debemos buscar a Dios. Este deseo profundo y sincero es el que nos permitirá vivir plenamente el mandamiento de amar a Dios y al prójimo. Con un corazón abierto y dispuesto, el amor se convierte en una experiencia transformadora que refleja el carácter de Dios en nuestra vida diaria.

Our Mission

It is not difficult to know what our mission is, since it is the very mission of the Church. This mission is expressed in Sacred Scripture, especially in the Gospels.

“Jesus approached them and spoke thus: “All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, then, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you all the days until the end of the world” (MT 28: 18-20).

This mission entrusted directly to the Apostles, today to the Bishops, extends to all baptized people. What we have received, we have to announce. Since I became aware of my being a Christian, I have assumed this task as my own. I have embraced it even more closely since being ordained a priest, and I rejoice that my bishop, Bishop Joe Vázquez, has directly entrusted to me this same ministry to be performed here in our parish.

That is why I state the mission this way:

“In unity with our Diocesan Church of Austin, following the

guidelines issued by our bishop, we seek to **EVANGELIZE, MAKE DISCIPLES, and FORM THE CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY.**”

EVANGELIZATION seeks to provoke the encounter with a God lived and real, through the basic preaching of the Kerygma (Greek for “proclamation” and refers to the Gospel) and prayer. This will take place through initiatives of the pastoral groups and others in the parish.

MAKING DISCIPLES is, undoubtedly, the most difficult task, since it consists in making Jesus the teacher in our lives and learning from Him how to live His teaching faithfully in every area of our life. This we will aim for through a continuous catechesis. The parish seeks to be a place of growth in faith.

FORM THE CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY This goal is the natural fruit of living a personal encounter with God and seeking His kingdom in our lives. We cannot live our faith alone. Rather, we need a community where we can share our experiences and nourish ourselves with the testimony of other brothers and sisters in Christ. St. Mary Immaculate Concepción wants to be a place where faith is lived. We intentionally live this way in the Liturgical assembly, in the ministry and service groups and in our own moments of coexistence and spirituality, koinonia (Christian fellowship or communion) and mystagogy (led through the mysteries of faith).

We are a church on the move that is renewed in the love of God and guided by the prompting of the Holy Spirit.

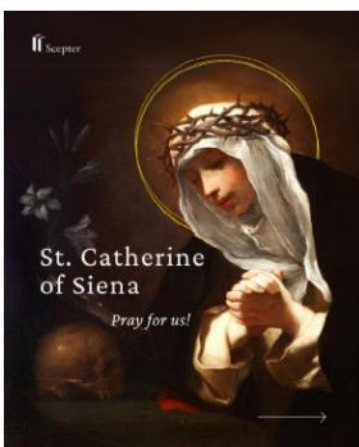

DEACON'S CORNER

You are close to the kingdom of God

In this week's Gospel reading a scribe asks Jesus "What is the first of all the commandments?" Jesus takes from Deuteronomy that we should love the Lord above all things, and then adds from Leviticus that we should love our neighbor as ourselves. He says: "There is no other commandment greater than these."

In the Gospel of Mark, the Pharisees, Sadducees and scribes had been trying to trap Jesus with questions on taxes and marriage laws. But then this scribe comes and asks an honest question and when Jesus answers it, the scribe acknowledges the truth of what Jesus has said. (That's why the reading ends with the line "And no one dared to ask him any more questions.") Jesus sees that the scribe understands exactly what Jesus is saying, so he adds "You are not far from the kingdom of God".

So, understanding that we are to love God and love our neighbor as ourselves brings us close to the kingdom of God, but not all the way there. What is still lacking? What is lacking is to place our understanding into action. To truly live by Jesus's teaching.

There is a saying: "The road to hell is paved with good intentions." It doesn't matter that we know what it is we should do, if when the moment comes to act, we fail to do it. Intending to do good is not the same as doing good. Knowing what God wants us to do is not enough.

It's not easy to always place God first in our lives; and sometimes our neighbors are not very lovable. But easy or not, it's necessary. And God is always there to help us and that makes all the difference.

RINCON DEL DIACONO

Estás cerca del reino de Dios

En la lectura del Evangelio de esta semana, un escriba le pregunta a Jesús: "¿Cuál es el primero de todos los mandamientos?". Jesús toma del Deuteronomio que debemos amar al Señor sobre todas las cosas, y luego agrega del Levítico que debemos amar a nuestro prójimo como a nosotros mismos. Dice: "No hay otro mandamiento mayor que estos".

En el Evangelio de Marcos, los fariseos, saduceos y escribas habían estado tratando de atrapar a Jesús con preguntas sobre impuestos y leyes matrimoniales. Pero entonces llega este escriba y hace una pregunta honesta y cuando Jesús la responde, el escriba reconoce la verdad de lo que Jesús ha dicho. (Es por eso que la lectura termina con la línea "Y nadie se atrevió a hacerle más preguntas".) Jesús ve que el escriba entiende exactamente lo que Jesús está diciendo, por lo que agrega: "No estás lejos del reino de Dios".

Por lo tanto, comprender que debemos amar a Dios y amar a nuestro prójimo como a nosotros mismos nos acerca al reino de Dios, pero no del todo. ¿Qué falta todavía? Lo que falta es poner nuestro entendimiento en acción. Vivir verdaderamente según la enseñanza de Jesús.

Hay un dicho: "El camino al infierno está pavimentado de buenas intenciones". No importa que sepamos qué es lo que debemos hacer, si cuando llega el momento de actuar, no lo hacemos. Tener la intención de hacer el bien no es lo mismo que hacer el bien. No basta con saber lo que Dios quiere que hagamos.

No es fácil poner siempre a Dios en primer lugar en nuestras vidas; y a veces nuestros vecinos no son muy amables. Pero, fácil o no, es necesario. Y Dios siempre está ahí para ayudarnos y eso hace toda la diferencia.
