

A Poetic and Figurative Language

The gospel reading from Mark, chapter 13, employs poetic and figurative language that can be unsettling if not understood correctly. This section, often titled the "Eschatological Discourse," uses apocalyptic literature to convey a profound message, reaching beyond a literal lesson. Jesus uses these images to capture attention and open us to a crucial reflection on our present life, moving away from technicalities or fear of the end of the world.

The End of the World: Reality and Figurative Sense

Jesus speaks of the end of the world, but not in a literal sense of catastrophic predictions. He mentions the sun darkening and stars falling, employing language often used by the prophets to announce a significant divine intervention. This symbolism emphasizes God's presence and love, not as a terrifying end but as an invitation to be mindful of the present and our relationship with the divine. This message calls us to live in love rather than in fear of future events.

Living in the Present Moment

Jesus invites us to observe "the fig tree" and recognize the signs of the present time. Although the world will end one day, we do not know when that will be; the only certainty is now. Jesus stresses the importance of living each day as an opportunity to find joy, express love, and seek God. Each day is unique, and our lives should focus on embracing the

present rather than worrying about tomorrow or dwelling on the past.

Reflection on Love and Time

The gospel teaches us that time is limited, and we must use it wisely to build an eternity in love. Living in constant concern over when the stars will fall or when the end will come is to lose sight of our life's purpose. Jesus reminds us that each act of love in the present is a step toward building eternity. Our focus should be on loving those around us and making the most of the time God has given us to live fully.

The Present as a Reflection of Eternity

Jesus, the eternal God who enters our time, invites us to view the present as a glimpse of eternity. The final reflection of the gospel reminds us not to dwell solely on poetic symbolism but to look beyond it and recognize the value of each moment. Living today in fullness and compassion is what truly matters, as eternity is a continuous present. Let us live each day with love and dedication, building a fulfilling life.

Un Lenguaje Poético y Figurado

El evangelio que leemos en el capítulo 13 de Marcos usa un lenguaje poético y figurado que puede asustar si no lo comprendemos correctamente. Esta sección, a menudo llamada "discurso escatológico," emplea una literatura apocalíptica para transmitir un mensaje profundo, más allá de una lección literal. Jesús usa estas imágenes para captar la atención y abrirnos a una reflexión importante sobre nuestra vida actual, sin enfocarnos en tecnicismos o miedo sobre el fin del mundo.

El Fin del Mundo: Realidad y Sentido Figurativo

Jesús menciona el fin del mundo, pero no en el sentido literal de predicciones catastróficas. Habla del sol apagándose y de las estrellas cayendo, usando un lenguaje común entre los profetas para anunciar una intervención divina significativa. Este simbolismo destaca la presencia y amor de Dios, no como un fin terrorífico, sino como una invitación a estar conscientes del presente y de nuestra relación con lo divino. Este mensaje nos llama a vivir en el amor y no en el temor de eventos futuros.

Vivir el Momento Presente

Jesús nos invita a observar "la higuera" y darnos cuenta de los signos del tiempo presente. Aunque un día el mundo se acabará, no sabemos cuándo será eso; lo único cierto es el ahora. Jesús recalca la importancia de vivir el día de hoy como una oportunidad para ser felices, expresar amor, y buscar a Dios. Cada día es único, y nuestra vida debe

enfocarse en aprovechar el presente en lugar de preocuparnos por el mañana o el pasado.

La Reflexión sobre el Amor y el Tiempo

El evangelio nos enseña que el tiempo es limitado y debemos usarlo sabiamente para construir una eternidad en amor. Vivir preocupados por cuándo caerán las estrellas o cuándo llegará el fin es perder de vista el propósito de nuestras vidas. Jesús nos recuerda que cada acto de amor en el presente es una construcción hacia la eternidad. Nuestro enfoque debe ser amar a quienes nos rodean y aprovechar el tiempo que Dios nos da para vivir plenamente.

El Presente como un Reflejo de la Eternidad

Jesús, Dios eterno que entra en nuestro tiempo, nos invita a contemplar el presente como una pequeña muestra de la eternidad. La reflexión final del evangelio nos recuerda no quedarnos solo en la simbología poética, sino mirar más allá y reconocer el valor de cada momento. Vivir en plenitud y compasión hoy es lo que en verdad importa, pues la eternidad es un presente continuo. Vivamos el día con amor y dedicación, construyendo una vida plena.

The Presider's Chair (Sede) as a Liturgical Place

The chair, like the ambo or altar, is one of the necessary liturgical places for the Eucharist and other liturgical offices. From the chair, the presider leads, prays, directs prayer, and delivers the homily. The chair signifies the office of Christ as Head, Shepherd, and Teacher, elevating it beyond the simple utility of sitting during hymns or being seated on equal chairs with others. A visit to ancient basilicas (such as San Vitale or San Clemente) reveals the prominent placement of the chair in the apse (where the presider is positioned above the continuous stone bench reserved for priests).

As a liturgical place, the chair should be set up wherever the Holy Mass is celebrated, not only in parish churches but also in any oratory, chapel, or church for contemplatives. It's not really appropriate to start Mass directly from the altar, which is reserved for the sacrifice; thus, the priest approaches the altar to deposit the offering and recite the Eucharistic prayer. Other parts of the Mass (such as the initial rites, the homily, and the final blessing) are led from the presider's chair. "The celebrant's chair signifies the role of presiding over the liturgical assembly and directing the prayer of the holy people" (Bend 982).

The Missal prescribes the characteristics of the chair: "The celebrant's chair should signify his ministry as president of the assembly and moderator of prayer. Therefore, its most suitable place is turned towards the people, at the back of the sanctuary, unless the building's structure or other circumstances prevent this—for example, if a great distance makes communication between the priest and the gathered assembly difficult, or if the tabernacle is located in the middle behind the altar. In addition, chairs should be arranged in the sanctuary for concelebrating priests and also for vested presbyters present at the celebration, even if they are not concelebrating. The deacon's seat should be near the celebrant's chair. For other ministers, chairs should be placed in such a way that they are clearly distinguished from the clergy's seats and allow them to easily perform their designated ministry (IGMR 310).

The liturgical symbolism of the chair is highlighted



when inaugurating a new chair; it is then blessed to be dedicated to liturgical use. The blessing prayer contemplates Christ's ministry as Pastor who continues shepherding from the liturgical chair: "We praise your Name, Lord, united in one voice, and humbly ask you, who came as the Good Shepherd to gather your scattered flock into one fold through those whom you have chosen as collaborators in the spread of truth. Shepherd your faithful and lead them on the path of holiness so that, one day, shepherds and sheep may enter together with joy into the eternal pastures" (Bend 987).

Or also: "Lord Jesus Christ, who taught the pastors of your Church to serve their brothers and not to be served, we ask that by your grace, all who come to this chair proclaim your word always and administer your sacraments worthily, so that, along with the people entrusted to them, they may ceaselessly praise you in the eternal seat of heaven" (Bend 999).

This highlights the liturgical importance of a bishop's installation in his diocese. When the Metropolitan presides, after reading the Apostolic Letters, "the Metropolitan invites the Bishop to sit in the chair. Then the Bishop stands, and the Gloria is sung" (CE 1145).

The same applies to the inauguration of a parish priest's ministry in his parish; the Bishop hands over to the new parish priest the various liturgical places (baptismal font, penitential seat...) and also the presider's chair (Cf. Entry of the new parish priest, n. 12).

The chair should have dignity, be visible, elevated, and suitable for leading prayer and delivering the homily from there.

In the Gospel, the eagle is the symbol of John, one of the four evangelists. The connection between the eagle and the Gospel of John arises because the prologue of this Gospel speaks of the Word, which is God, and drives away darkness to bring light. This is compared to the eagle, which flies and fixes its gaze on the sun's light without being blinded.

In general, the eagle is a symbol of majesty, courage, spiritual inspiration, power, and speed. In the Bible, in Isaiah 40:31, it says that: "those who wait on the Lord shall renew their strength and shall mount up with wings like eagles."

The four evangelists are represented by four symbols, known as the Tetramorph. The other three symbols are:

- The angel or man of Matthew, which represents the humanity of Christ and symbolizes the Nativity.
- The lion of Mark, which refers to the Baptist and signifies the resurrection.
- The ox of Luke, which symbolizes the passion of Jesus.



Alongside the Presider's Chair (Sede), the preferred place for the homily, there is often an eagle, symbolizing Saint John the Evangelist, the apostle who was the first to see the empty tomb and understand that Christ had risen. Additionally, the message proclaimed from the chair is a paschal message, meaning the homily will always be Christ-centered, a message of hope that inspires us to look to things above.

This dispensation is valid for all the faithful of the Diocese of Austin, wherever they may be, as well as for all those actually present within the territory of the Diocese of Austin on December 9.

The faithful who are able are encouraged to attend Mass on December 9 of their own free will, and I warmly invite all the faithful of the Diocese of Austin to join with me in invoking the intercession of Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception, the patroness of our Diocese and of our country.



Once a priest was giving a lecture to a class of fifth-graders and explained to them that Muslims believed that one day God would come and it would be the end of the world; that Jews believed in a Messiah who had not come yet, but when he did it would be the end of the world, and Christians believed the

Messiah had already come and when he came again it would be the end of the world. At this point the children started looking at each other since none of this sounded very optimistic.

Our readings for the 33 rd Sunday in Ordinary Time focus on the second coming of Jesus and remind us that this world will indeed end. Just as with all the other promises of God, this one is trustworthy. There are numerous passages in scripture that remind us to be prepared for either our end in death or our end at the end of the world when Jesus comes again. There's a great temptation to ignore the reality of death and to live our lives as if we are going to live forever. The Church helps us to avoid this temptation by reminding us from time to time that this life will end.

Once I was complaining to a good friend of mine (also a deacon), about all the spacing and disinfecting that was going on during Covid-19. He said: "Well, we want people to feel safe." I laughed and replied that I didn't want people to feel safe. That I worked very hard in my homilies to make them feel as unsafe as possible.

"Teach us to number our days that we may gain wisdom." Ps 90:12

In life we should strive to strike a balance between being overly focused on death and ignoring it's reality. When we do, we make much better decisions.






