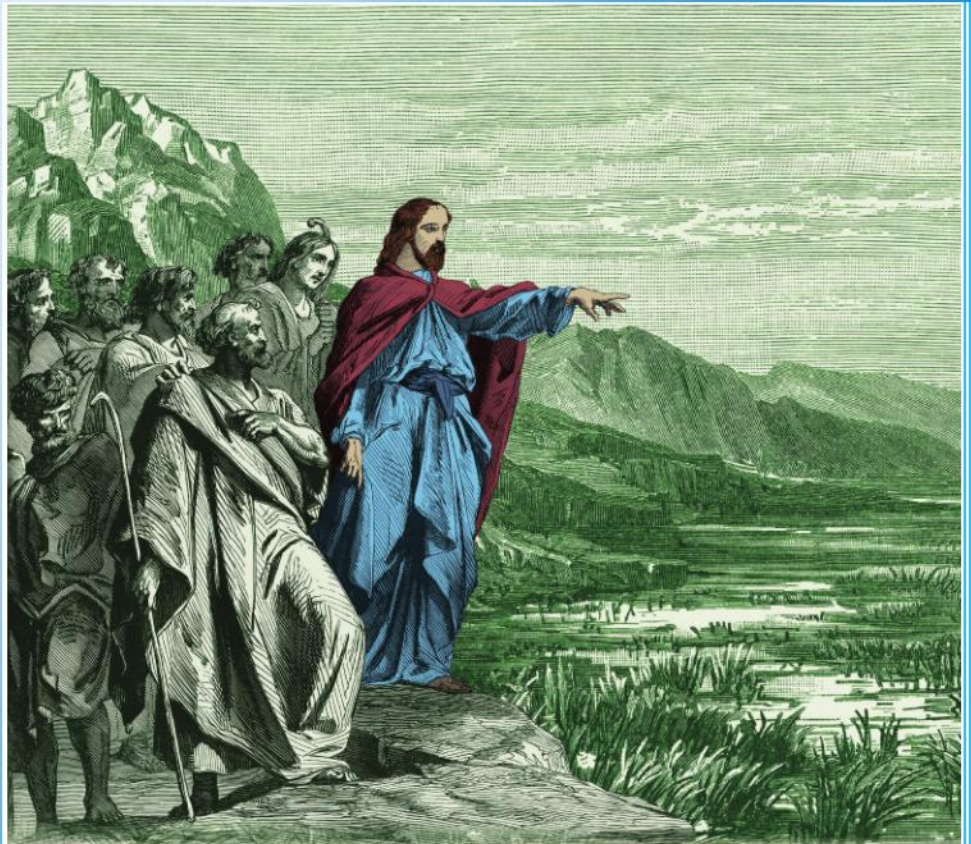

Your Mission in Life: A Calling to Transform the World from the Heart

We Are All Called

The Gospel presents Jesus sending out **seventy-two disciples**, not just the Twelve. This reveals a profound truth: **each of us has a mission**. You are not a product of chance; God thought of you from eternity, and He has placed a unique purpose within your heart. Your life finds its deepest meaning when you discover and embrace that mission.

The Greatest Vocational Prayer: "Here I Am"

Before sending the disciples, Jesus warns that *"the harvest is great, but the laborers are few."* Therefore, He invites them to pray. Yet the most powerful prayer is not simply asking for vocations, but rather **offering oneself**: *"Here I am, Lord. How can I serve you?"* This openness is an act of courage—especially in a world so in need of authentic witnesses. If you have ever asked yourself, *"Why not me?"*, your heart is already beginning to respond.

Travel Light: Let Go in Order to Go Far

Jesus advises His disciples to **carry little**. The mission does not require excess baggage. What truly matters is not what we possess, but the **inner freedom to serve**. One illustrative story tells of a wealthy woman who travels to meet a wise man. Surprised by his lack of possessions, she asks, *"Where are your things?"* He replies, *"I too am traveling. If I carried too much, I wouldn't enjoy the journey of life."* Like him, we must **travel light**—materially and emotionally—to reach our destination.

The Weight of Our Own Ideas

We carry more than physical things; we also bring **fixed expectations and rigid ideas**. This is especially evident in pastoral ministry, where imported plans often clash with local realities. True mission demands **discernment, openness, and trust in the Gospel**, rather than strict adherence to our own strategies. Letting go of preconceived ideas makes space for the new work God desires to accomplish.

Only Love Can Transform

In the work of transformation, only love begets love. Only true peace creates more peace. Only authentic freedom can foster freedom. **It is the Gospel—not human plans—that can truly touch and change hearts.** And if you find yourself in a place where the mission is not welcomed, Jesus says, *"Shake the dust from your feet."* Let go of resentment, criticism, or past wounds—they will weigh you down like mud on your shoes. **Forgive, release, and move forward.**

True Joy Is Not in External Success

When the disciples return rejoicing that *"even the demons are subject to us,"* Jesus reminds them: *"Rejoice rather that your names are written in heaven."* External victories are fleeting. What matters most is not what we achieve on earth, but that our **identity is rooted in eternity**. Let your joy be found in what never changes.

The Goal: Do the Best You Can

In the end, what truly counts is not perfect execution, but having done your best with sincerity. As one person beautifully said, *"Lord, perhaps I misunderstood You. Perhaps I failed. But I did the best I could."* May this become your prayer as well. **Faithful effort has eternal value**, even when the results remain unseen.

Your Mission Begins with You

Your mission begins by **conquering your own heart**. To do this, you don't need to carry more—you need to **let go of what holds you back**. Above all, you need to **trust**. God is calling you to transform the world, and that transformation begins when you encounter His love and share it with those around you.

Tu Misión en la Vida: Una Llamada a Transformar el Mundo desde el Corazón

Todos estamos llamados

El Evangelio nos presenta a Jesús enviando a **72 discípulos**, no solo a los Doce. Esto revela una verdad profunda: **todos tenemos una misión**. Nadie es fruto del azar; Dios pensó en ti desde la eternidad y ha puesto en tu corazón un propósito único. Tu vida tiene sentido cuando descubres y abrazas esa misión.

La mejor oración vocacional: “Aquí estoy”

Antes de enviarlos, Jesús advierte que “la mies es mucha y los obreros pocos”. Por eso invita a orar. Pero la mejor oración no es solo pedir por vocaciones, sino **ofrecerse uno mismo**: “*Heme aquí, Señor, en qué puedo servirte.*” Esta disposición es una respuesta valiente, especialmente en un mundo necesitado de testigos auténticos. Si te preguntas “¿por qué no yo?”, ya estás abriendo tu corazón a esa misión.

Viajar ligero: desprenderse para avanzar

Jesús aconseja a sus discípulos no llevar mucho consigo. La **misión no requiere cargas innecesarias**. Lo esencial no es lo que posees, sino la libertad interior para servir. Una anécdota ilustra esta verdad: una mujer rica viaja a conocer a un sabio, y al preguntarle por qué vive sin posesiones, él responde: “*Yo también estoy de viaje, y no quiero que mis pertenencias me impidan disfrutar el camino.*” Así también nosotros: viajar ligeros de equipaje —material y emocional— nos permite avanzar hacia la meta.

El peso de las ideas y expectativas

Además de bienes, **también cargamos ideas rígidas**, planes cerrados que no se ajustan a la realidad. Esto es especialmente evidente en la pastoral, donde los esquemas ajenos muchas veces no aplican. La verdadera misión requiere **flexibilidad, discernimiento y confianza en el Evangelio**, no en nuestras estructuras mentales. Soltar nuestras expectativas nos prepara para recibir lo que Dios quiera mostrarnos.

Solo el amor transforma

Cuando se trata de cambiar el mundo, solo el amor, la paz y la libertad genuina pueden generar más de sí mismos. El Evangelio —y no nuestras estrategias humanas— es lo único capaz de **tocar y transformar los corazones**. Si llegas a un lugar y no eres recibido, Jesús nos dice: “*Sacúdete el polvo de los pies.*” No cargues con críticas, rencores o heridas: eso te pesará, como lodo que impide caminar. **Suelta, perdona, y sigue avanzando.**

La verdadera alegría no está en el éxito

Cuando los discípulos regresan felices porque “hasta los demonios se sometían”, Jesús les dice: “*Alégrense más bien de que sus nombres estén escritos en el cielo.*” No pongas tu gozo en logros visibles o temporales. Hoy puedes tener éxito; mañana, quizás no. Pero lo eterno permanece. **Tu nombre en el cielo** es el único reconocimiento que importa realmente.

La meta: hacer lo mejor que puedas

Al final, lo que cuenta no es haber hecho todo a la perfección, sino **haberlo intentado con el corazón**. Como decía un autor: “*Señor, quizás no entendí bien, quizás fallé, pero hice lo mejor que pude.*” Que esta sea también tu oración. La fidelidad sincera vale más que cualquier resultado.

La misión empieza en ti

Tu misión comienza por **conquistar tu propio corazón**. Para ello, no necesitas cargar más cosas, sino dejar las que estorban. Y sobre todo, necesitas **confiar**. Dios te llama a transformar este mundo, y esa transformación inicia cuando encuentras su amor y lo compartes con los que te rodean.

WELCOME REV. RAPHAEL EZEH

He is: Missionary Society of St Paul of Nigeria Father Raphael Ezeh (pronounced EH-zeh). Ordained in Nigeria in 1996. Arrived in USA 1999. Installed as pastor at Corpus Christi Parish in Bronzeville by Bishop Joseph Perry April 29, 2007.

Youth: My father died of an illness before I was born. I have three sisters and a brother. I was born in 1966, just before the Nigerian Civil War. Fortunately the war ended before we had to evacuate. I was a baby, but from the stories I heard, it was rough -- a lot of poverty and starvation. Most of us had to go and live with relatives. I lived with Mom until I was 9. She cared for the family the best she could, a loving and resilient woman. There was a whole lot of living here and there. In Nigerian society, living with relatives is common and comfortable due to our extended family system. I lived with my maternal grandma too, and my uncle put me through school."

School: "Our family was Catholic. The priests who laid the groundwork were the Holy Ghost Fathers. I attended a government-run Catholic school at the cathedral. I served Mass. Secondary school was public. I'd go to school, come home, go to the market, take care of chores, and then go play soccer. I think I was pretty good at soccer. In the beginning we mostly played barefoot, but going away for school games we got to wear something."

Vocation: "The Nigerians' spirituality is very deep. But when I wanted to go to the seminary my mother refused for many years. When I finally decided to go ahead, it was without her permission. Everybody in my family and extended family was against it, except my uncle. It's a big deal in the tribe about getting married and having children, and there were just two boys in our family. I wanted to be a missionary, to share the Good News, and grow closer to God. Those things were paramount. By the time I got to the diaconate my Mom accepted it. At the time of my first Mass my elder sister still wished I'd come home."

Priesthood: The Holy Spirit carried me through. The vocation director from the Society of St. Paul came to our school and talked to us. I didn't know the difference between diocesan and missionary priests. When he explained it, I realized the apostolic life of St. Paul was what I was looking for. Seminary training was hard. We started with 25 and only 12 made it to ordination.

"My first assignments were in Nigeria, then after a couple years the superior called me and said he was sending me to the United States." His order's first house in the USA is in Houston, Texas. After some time there learning Spanish and working in their Mission Office, he became pastor at Our Lady of Lourdes in New Orleans. When Hurricane Katrina struck, he was out of the country. Later he joined the massive clean-up. When the archdiocese closed his parish, he was sent to Chicago to relieve another MSP priest at Corpus Christi Parish. He was assigned as parochial vicar at St. Louis Catholic Church in Waco in 2024.

Leisure: "I had a knee injury so I can't play soccer now - but I play tennis. I love movies. My favorite is "The Passion of the Christ." I love that movie! One of my favorite books is John Powell's "Happiness is an Inside Job." I enjoy the intersection between spirituality and human nature - they combine to make us a better and more fulfilled person."



BIENVENIDO PADRE RAPHAEL EZEH

Él es: Padre Rafael Ezech (pronunciado EH-zeh) de la Sociedad Misionera de San Pablo de Nigeria. Ordenado en Nigeria en 1996. Llegó a USA en 1999. Fue nombrado párroco de la parroquia Corpus Christi en Bronzeville por el obispo Joseph Perry el 29 de abril de 2007.

Juventud: Mi padre falleció de una enfermedad antes de que yo naciera. Tengo tres hermanas y un hermano. Nací en 1966, justo antes de la Guerra Civil de Nigeria. Afortunadamente, la guerra terminó antes de que tuviéramos que evacuar. Era un bebé, pero por lo que escuché, fue duro: mucha pobreza y hambre. La mayoría de nosotros tuvimos que ir a vivir con familiares. Viví con mamá hasta los 9 años. Ella cuidó de la familia lo mejor que pudo; era una mujer amorosa y resiliente. Había mucho que vivir aquí y allá. En la sociedad nigeriana, vivir con familiares es común y cómodo debido a nuestro sistema de familia extendida. "Yo también viví con mi abuela materna y mi tío me financió los estudios".

Estudios: "Nuestra familia era católica. Los sacerdotes que sentaron las bases fueron los Padres del Espíritu Santo. Asistí a una escuela católica pública en la catedral. Seriva en la Misa. La secundaria era pública. Iba a la escuela, llegaba a casa, iba al mercado, hacía las tareas del hogar y luego jugaba al fútbol. Creo que era bastante bueno jugando al fútbol. Al principio jugábamos casi siempre descalzos, pero al salir para los partidos escolares nos poníamos algo."

Vocación: "La espiritualidad de los nigerianos es muy profunda. Pero cuando quise ir al seminario, mi madre se negó durante muchos años. Cuando finalmente decidí ir, fue sin su permiso. Todos en mi familia, y en mi familia extendida, estaban en contra, excepto mi tío. Casarse y tener hijos es un asunto muy importante en la tribu, y solo éramos dos varones en nuestra familia. Quería ser misionero, compartir la Buena Nueva y acercarme a Dios. Esas cosas eran primordiales. Para cuando llegué al diaconado, mi madre lo aceptó. En mi primera misa, mi hermana mayor aún deseaba que volviera a casa".

Sacerdocio: El Espíritu Santo me ayudó a seguir adelante. El director de vocaciones de la Sociedad de San Pablo vino a nuestra escuela y habló con nosotros. No sabía la diferencia entre sacerdotes diocesanos y misioneros. Cuando me lo explicó, me di cuenta de que la vida apostólica de San Pablo era lo que buscaba. La formación en el seminario fue dura. Empezamos con 25 y solo 12 llegaron a la ordenación.

"Mis primeras asignaciones fueron en Nigeria, y después de un par de años, el superior me llamó y me dijo que me enviaba a Estados Unidos". La primera casa de su orden en USA está en Houston, Texas. Después de un tiempo allí aprendiendo español y trabajando en la Oficina de Misiones, se convirtió en párroco de Nuestra Señora de Lourdes en Nueva Orleans. Cuando azotó el huracán Katrina, se encontraba fuera del país. Más tarde, se unió a la limpieza masiva. Cuando la arquidiócesis cerró su parroquia, fue enviado a Chicago para relevar a otro sacerdote de la Orden de San Luis en la parroquia de Corpus Christi. Fue asignado como vicario parroquial en la iglesia católica de San Luis en Waco, Texas en 2024.

Gustos: "Tuve una lesión de rodilla, así que ahora no puedo jugar al fútbol, pero juego al tenis. Me encantan las películas. Mi favorita es "La Pasión de Cristo". ¡Me encanta esa película! Uno de mis libros favoritos es "La felicidad es un trabajo interno" de John Powell. "Disfruto de la intersección entre la espiritualidad y la naturaleza humana: se combinan para hacernos personas mejores y más plenas".

DEACON'S CORNER

What are we to do?

Today we take up a difficult subject. Just what are we to do when we find ourselves in disagreement with the Church? How do we resolve it as good and faithful people of God? It's critically important that we don't become angry and abandon the Church, since the Church is our pathway to heaven. Indeed, the dogmatic constitution of the Church tells us that we can't be saved if we reject the Church: *"They cannot be saved who, knowing that the Catholic Church was founded as necessary by God through Christ, would refuse either to enter it or remain in it. - Lumen Gentium 14"*. So, when we find ourselves in this difficult situation, it is essential that we find a way to resolve it.

Probably the first thing we should do is to consider the possibility that we may be wrong, and the Church may be right. That will allow us to keep an open mind and will help keep us from getting angry. The second thing we could do is find out what the Church really teaches on a subject. More times than I can count I have found people who have been given information on what the church teaches that is just plain wrong. Often these people have left the church and stayed away angry for no reason at all, simply because they never bothered to learn what the Church actually says.

This is why every home should have a copy of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. You should have a reliable guide when trying to understand what the Church is telling you. Remember that the Church is always willing to explain her reasoning. The Church will never declare something to be sinful or wrong without explaining the why. Jesus left us the Church as a sure guide to get us to heaven. Guided by the Holy Spirit He promises that she will not lead us astray. I certainly trust her far more than I trust my own judgement.

RINCON DEL DIACONO

¿Qué debemos hacer?

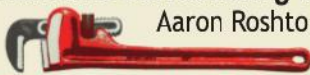
Hoy abordamos un tema difícil. ¿Qué debemos hacer cuando nos encontramos en desacuerdo con la Iglesia? ¿Cómo lo resolvemos como buenos y fieles siervos de Dios? Es fundamental que no nos enojemos ni abandonemos la Iglesia, ya que ella es nuestro camino al cielo. De hecho, la constitución dogmática de la Iglesia nos dice que no podemos salvarnos si la rechazamos: «No se salvarán quienes, sabiendo que la Iglesia católica fue fundada como necesaria por Dios mediante Cristo, rehúsen entrar en ella o permanecer en ella.» (Lumen Gentium 14). Por lo tanto, cuando nos encontramos en esta difícil situación, es esencial que encontremos la manera de resolverla.

Probablemente, lo primero que deberíamos hacer es considerar la posibilidad de que estemos equivocados y que la Iglesia tenga razón. Esto nos permitirá mantener una mente abierta y evitará que nos enojemos. Lo segundo que podríamos hacer es averiguar qué enseña realmente la Iglesia sobre un tema. Me he encontrado con muchísimas más personas a quienes se les ha dado información sobre lo que la Iglesia enseña y que es simplemente erróneo. A menudo, estas personas han abandonado la iglesia y se han alejado enojadas sin motivo alguno, simplemente porque nunca se molestaron en aprender lo que la Iglesia realmente dice.

Por eso, cada hogar debería tener una copia del Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica. Debes tener una guía confiable para entender lo que la Iglesia te dice. Recuerda que la Iglesia siempre está dispuesta a explicar su razonamiento. La Iglesia nunca declarará algo pecaminoso o incorrecto sin explicar el porqué.
