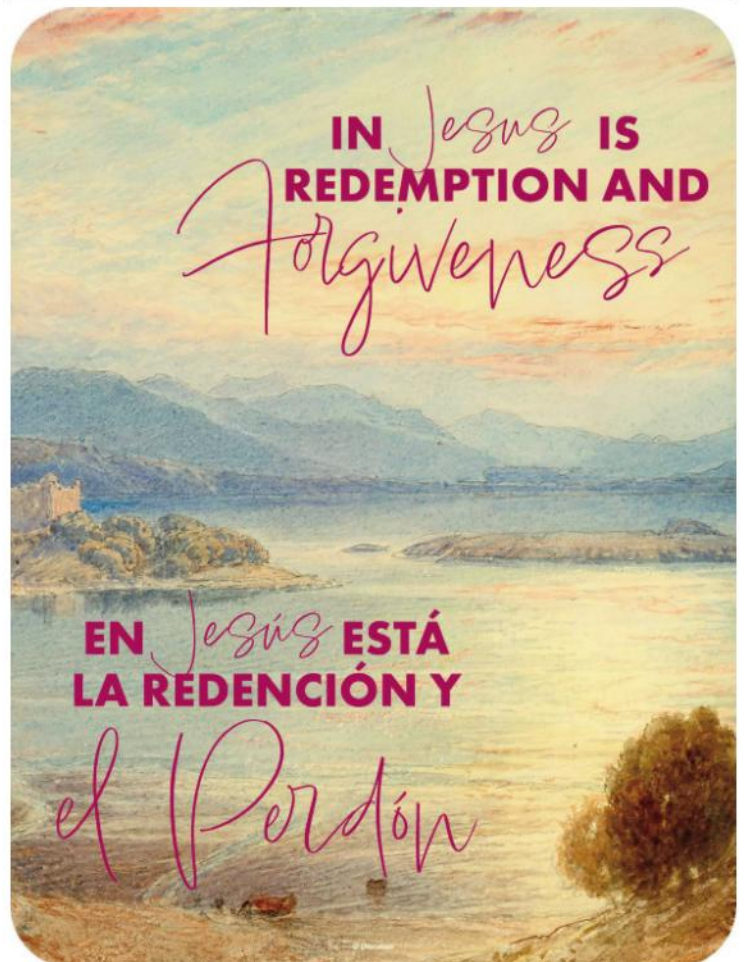

Excuses, excuses...



If you get pulled over for speeding, you might have several excuses to use, but did you ever say that you didn't know you had to obey the speed limit? As the saying goes, ignorance of the law is no excuse. That is what Moses is telling the people in the first reading. The laws of God are not difficult to understand. Anyone with a conscience should be able to live with them.

By the time of Jesus, the scribes and Pharisees had added many more laws. The scholar who questioned Jesus about eternal life knew what was important: loving God with all your being and loving your neighbor as yourself. If he had stopped there, he would have been all right. But by asking "Who is my neighbor?" he implied that there are limits to love. That's why Jesus used the parable of the good Samaritan to show that love is as simple as helping someone in need.

Even today, we find people making excuses for not doing what God asks of us. We want someone else to interpret it for us, hoping they will find a loophole we can use to ignore God's commands. We judge people who need help, saying they choose to be poor or homeless. We say that between work and family obligations, we have no time to give to the community. We sign our kids up for so many sports that we don't even go to church on Sundays. We always have time to watch our favorite TV shows, but there's never enough time for daily prayers.

Before you start beating yourself up with guilt, remember that God expects us to take care of our families, to spend time with our children, and even to take time to rest and relax. If we are willing to look at our lives and bring them to God, asking for guidance, we are making the first steps to keep God's law of love. Even Jesus, whom Paul describes in the second reading as the image of God and source of all creation, had to die on the cross to show God's love to the world. Jesus understands the difficult choices we make.

Ask for his help and you shall receive.



Si te detienen por exceso de velocidad, es posible que tengas varias excusas, pero ¿alguna vez dijiste que no sabías que tenías que respetar el límite de velocidad? Como dice el refrán, la ignorancia de la ley no es excusa. Eso es lo que Moisés le dice al pueblo en la primera lectura. Las leyes de Dios no son difíciles de entender. Cualquiera con conciencia debería poder vivirlas.

En la época de Jesús, los escribas y fariseos habían añadido muchas más leyes. El erudito que le preguntó a Jesús sobre la vida eterna sabía lo que era importante: amar a Dios con todo tu ser y amar al prójimo como a ti mismo. Si se hubiera detenido allí, habría estado bien. Pero al preguntar “¿Y quién es mi prójimo?”, dio a entender que el amor tiene límites. Por eso Jesús utilizó la parábola del buen samaritano para mostrar que el amor es tan simple como ayudar a una persona necesitada.

Incluso hoy, encontramos personas que ponen excusas para no hacer lo que Dios nos pide. Queremos que alguien más lo interprete por nosotros, con la esperanza de que encuentre una escapatoria que podamos usar para ignorar los mandatos de Dios. Juzgamos a las personas que necesitan ayuda, diciendo que eligen ser pobres o sin hogar. Decimos que entre el trabajo y las obligaciones familiares, no tenemos tiempo para dar a la comunidad. Inscribimos a nuestros hijos en tantos deportes que ni siquiera vamos a la iglesia los domingos. Siempre tenemos tiempo para ver nuestros programas de televisión favoritos, pero nunca hay tiempo suficiente para las oraciones diarias.

Antes de comenzar a castigarte con la culpa, recuerda que Dios espera que cuidemos a nuestras familias, que pasemos tiempo con nuestros hijos e incluso que nos tomemos tiempo para descansar y relajarnos. Si estamos dispuestos a mirar nuestras vidas y llevarlas a Dios, pidiendo guía, estamos dando los primeros pasos para cumplir la ley de amor de Dios. Incluso Jesús, a quien Pablo describe en la segunda lectura como la imagen de Dios y fuente de toda la creación, tuvo que morir en la cruz para mostrar el amor de Dios al mundo. Jesús entiende las decisiones difíciles que tomamos.

Pide su ayuda y la recibirás.

BISHOP DANIEL E. GARCIA

THE SIXTH BISHOP OF AUSTIN

Bishop Daniel E. Garcia was born on August 30, 1960, and grew up in Waco and Cameron, Texas. He is bilingual in English and Spanish and has three younger sisters.

He earned an Associate of Arts degree from Tyler Junior College in 1982, followed by a Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Arts from the University of St. Thomas in Houston in 1984, while attending St. Mary Seminary. He went on to receive a Master of Divinity in 1988. Bishop Garcia was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Austin on May 28, 1988, by Bishop John E. McCarthy. In 2007, he earned a Master of Arts in Liturgical Studies from St. John's University in Collegeville, Minnesota.

Throughout his ministry, Bishop Garcia served in numerous parishes and leadership roles. His first assignments were as associate pastor at St. Catherine of Siena Parish, Cristo Rey Parish, and St. Louis King of France Parish, all in Austin. From 1992 to 1995, he served in the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston at St. Mary Magdalene Parish in Humble, Texas. In 1995, he was named the founding pastor of St. Vincent de Paul Parish in Austin, where he guided the community through its formation and multiple building projects, including the construction of a permanent church and sanctuary.

Beyond parish ministry, Bishop Garcia held several diocesan roles, including service in the Vocation Office, Priests' Personnel Board, College of Consultors, and the Presbyteral Council, where he also served as chair. He was Dean of the Austin North Deanery and contributed to the Liturgical Commission, Diaconal Advisory Committee, and served as Master of Ceremonies for the Bishop's Office.

In 2014, he was appointed Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia for the Diocese of Austin by Archbishop Joe S. Vásquez. The following year, Pope Francis appointed him Auxiliary Bishop of Austin.

In 2018, Pope Francis named Bishop Garcia the Bishop of the Diocese of Monterey, California.

Bishop Garcia has served on the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) Committee on Communications and the Committee on Divine Worship. He also chaired the Subcommittee on Divine Worship in Spanish and currently continues to serve on that subcommittee. He is also a member of the Board of Directors for Catholic Relief Services.

OBISPO DANIEL E. GARCIA EL SEXTO OBISPO DE AUSTIN

El Obispo Daniel E. García nació el 30 de agosto de 1960 y creció en Waco y Cameron, Texas. Es bilingüe en inglés y español y tiene tres hermanas menores.

Obtuvo un título de Asociado en Artes del Tyler Junior College en 1982, seguido de una Licenciatura en Artes Liberales de la Universidad de St. Thomas en Houston en 1984, mientras asistía al Seminario St. Mary. Posteriormente, obtuvo una Maestría en Divinidad en 1988. El Obispo García fue ordenado sacerdote para la Diócesis de Austin el 28 de mayo de 1988 por el Obispo John E. McCarthy. En 2007, obtuvo una Maestría en Estudios Litúrgicos de la Universidad de St. John en Collegeville, Minnesota.

A lo largo de su ministerio, el Obispo García sirvió en numerosas parroquias y desempeñó cargos de liderazgo. Sus primeras asignaciones fueron como vicario parroquial en las parroquias de Santa Catalina de Siena, Cristo Rey y San Luis Rey de Francia, todas en Austin. De 1992 a 1995, sirvió en la Arquidiócesis de Galveston-Houston, en la Parroquia de Santa María Magdalena en Humble, Texas. En 1995, fue nombrado párroco fundador de la Parroquia de San Vicente de Paúl en Austin, donde guió a la comunidad en su formación y en múltiples proyectos de construcción, incluyendo la construcción de una iglesia y un santuario permanentes.

Además del ministerio parroquial, el Obispo García desempeñó diversos cargos diocesanos, incluyendo la Oficina de Vocaciones, la Junta de Personal Sacerdotal, el Colegio de Consultores y el Consejo Presbiteral, del cual también fue presidente. Fue Decano del Decanato de Austin Norte y contribuyó a la Comisión Litúrgica, al Comité Asesor Diaconal y se desempeñó como Maestro de Ceremonias del Obispado.

En 2014, fue nombrado Vicario General y Moderador de la Curia para la Diócesis de Austin por el Arzobispo Joe S. Vásquez. Al año siguiente, el Papa Francisco lo nombró Obispo Auxiliar de Austin.

En 2018, el Papa Francisco lo nombró Obispo García de la Diócesis de Monterey, California.

El Obispo García ha sido miembro del Comité de Comunicaciones y del Comité de Culto Divino de la Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos (USCCB). También presidió el Subcomité de Culto Divino en Español y actualmente forma parte de dicho subcomité. También es miembro de la Junta Directiva de Catholic Relief Services.

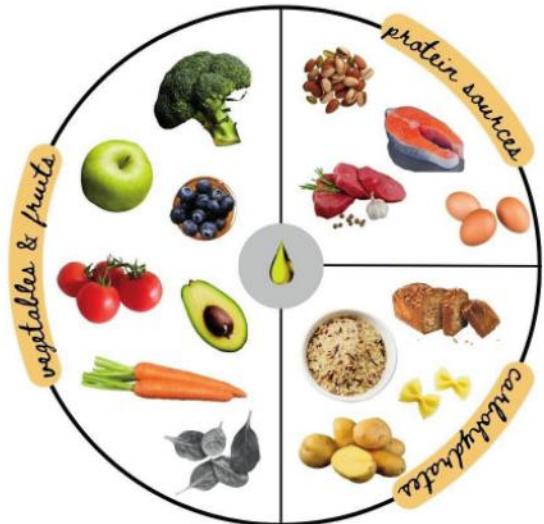

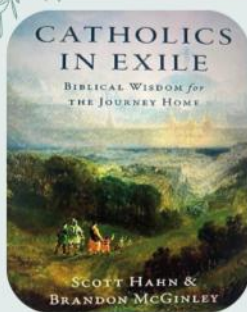

I did a google search on “welcoming church” and was surprised at how much information flooded back at me on the subject. Apparently, there are books written on the subject and lists of ‘best practices’ on how you can ‘turn visitors into members’. I was provided sample greetings, advice on how to make fun spaces for children, and how this is all very biblical, since we were told to welcome the stranger. However, when I looked at the sign in front of our church, what I read is the times for masses and confession. Is this welcoming enough?

Well, far be it for me to ignore all this great advice from the internet, and with all due respect to the authors of these books, these attempts to be welcoming seem a bit superficial. Jesus didn’t say go out and get customers; he said to go out and make disciples. The first steps in becoming a disciple is to repent and believe in the gospel message of Jesus. It’s not about joining a club and paying dues; it’s about asking forgiveness and accepting Christ’s gift of salvation. Anyone who has made a good confession knows the feeling of being free of your sins. The world is brighter, and you feel the joy of Christ’s presence. A great weight that you didn’t even realize you were under is suddenly gone.

If someone was laboring under a heavy load, what would be more welcome to him? Someone coming up and greeting him warmly and telling him to have a nice day, or someone who is going to help him remove the great weight he is under? Telling people the times for confession seems very ‘welcoming’ to me.

Then there is the mass; the source and summit of our Catholic life. Here we ‘re-member’ Christ as he asked us to do. He comes to us again, body and blood, soul and divinity, for us to share in his sacrifice. Here we are fed with his body and blood, so that we will have life because of him and so he will raise us on the last day. How could you be invited to anything more special than that?

So as I look at it, I think our sign is quite welcoming. Confession times and mass times. What could be more welcoming than that.

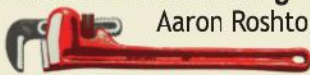
