Be Careful What You Ask For

Jesus talks about praying for whatever we need with faith and confidence, but he ends by asking, “How much more will the Father . . . give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?” (Luke 1:13). Is he saying there are limits to what we can ask for?

“Be careful what you ask for,” the saying warns. Just because we want something doesn’t mean it will be good for us. Remember the Indiana Jones movies? The artifact that the bad guys were seeking usually turned out to be lethal. But if we have enough faith to pray for something, we probably would not pray for anything evil. So what is Jesus really saying? He is giving us two lessons about prayer.

First, he assures us that God does hear our prayers and answers them. Many people take “ask and you shall receive” so literally that they expect God to do their bidding no matter what they want. Prayers, however, are not a magical ritual that somehow forces God to do our will. God is free to do what is best for us, free to answer some prayers with a no when what we seek is against God’s will. So maybe our first prayer should be to ask God to show us what we really need.

That leads us to the second lesson: prayer changes us, not God. If we truly pray as Jesus prayed, we would ask for what we need, adding, “Not as I will, but as you will” (Matthew 26:39). If we pray humbly and are open to what God wills for us, we will begin to see that what we really need most is actually God. It’s not easy to change our minds about what we want or need. To change our desires from selfish to holy takes a lot of power, the power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus was raised from the dead by that power and we will be, too (Romans 8:11). Mary conceived by the power of the Spirit (Matthew 1:18). The bread and wine of the Eucharist become the Body and Blood of Christ by the Spirit’s power. So when Jesus promises that the Father will give the Spirit to us for the asking, the Spirit is both the source of and the answer to our prayers. Let us ask the Spirit to empower us to desire and pray for what we really need

Ten Cuidado Con Lo Que Pides



Jesús habla de orar por todo lo que necesitamos con fe y confianza, pero termina preguntando: “¿cuánto más el Padre celestial dará el Espíritu Santo a quienes se lo pidan?” (Lucas 1,13). ¿Está diciendo que hay límites a lo que podemos pedir?

“Ten cuidado con lo que pides”, advierte el dicho. El hecho de que queramos algo no significa que sea bueno para nosotros. ¿Recuerdas las películas de Indiana Jones? El artefacto que buscaban los malos generalmente resultaba letal. Pero si tenemos suficiente fe para orar por algo, probablemente no oraríamos por nada malo. Entonces, ¿qué está diciendo Jesús? Nos está dando dos lecciones sobre la oración.

Primero, nos asegura que Dios escucha nuestras oraciones y las responde. Muchas personas toman el “pidan y se les dará” tan literalmente que esperan que Dios haga lo que les piden sin importar lo que quieran. Las oraciones, sin embargo, no son un ritual mágico que de alguna manera obliga a Dios a hacer nuestra voluntad. Dios es libre de hacer lo que es mejor para nosotros, libre de responder con un no a algunas oraciones cuando lo que buscamos va en contra de la voluntad de Dios. Así que tal vez nuestra primera oración debería ser pedirle a Dios que nos muestre lo que realmente necesitamos.

Eso nos lleva a la segunda lección: la oración nos cambia a nosotros, no a Dios. Si oramos verdaderamente como Jesús oró, pediríamos lo que necesitamos, añadiendo: “No según mi voluntad sino la tuya” (Mateo 26,39). Si oramos con humildad y estamos abiertos a la voluntad de Dios para nosotros, comenzaremos a ver que lo que más necesitamos es a Dios. No es fácil cambiar de opinión sobre lo que queremos o necesitamos. Cambiar nuestros deseos de egoístas a santos requiere mucho poder, el poder del Espíritu Santo. Jesús fue resucitado de entre los muertos por ese poder y nosotros también lo seremos (Romanos 8,11). María concibió por el poder del Espíritu (Mateo 1,18). El pan y el vino de la Eucaristía se convierten en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo por el poder del Espíritu. Por eso, cuando Jesús promete que el Padre nos dará el Espíritu si se lo pedimos, el Espíritu es a la vez la fuente y la respuesta a nuestras oraciones. Pidámosle al Espíritu que nos dé fuerzas para desear y orar por lo que realmente necesitamos.

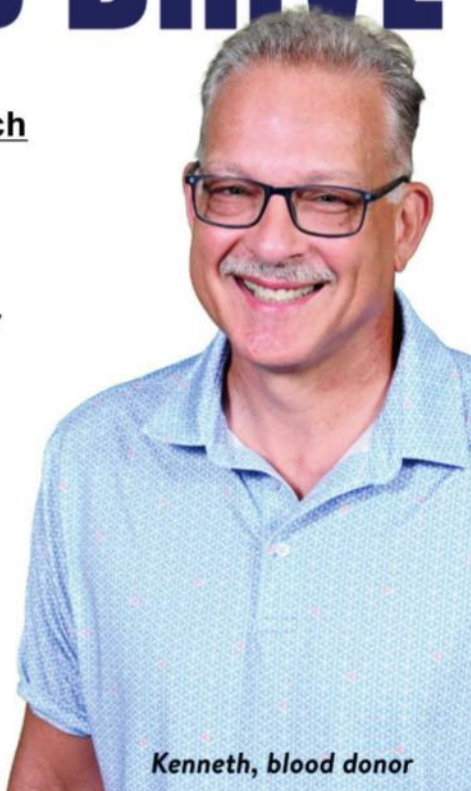

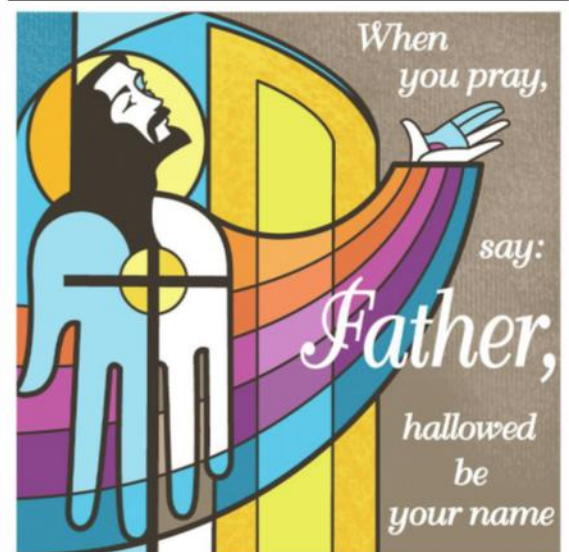

Our Mission

It is not difficult to know what our mission is, since it is the very mission of the Church. This mission is expressed in Sacred Scripture, especially in the Gospels.

"Jesus approached them and spoke thus: "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, then, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you all the days until the end of the world" (MT 28: 18-20).

This mission entrusted directly to the Apostles, today to the Bishops, extends to all baptized people. What we have received, we have to announce. Since I became aware of my being a Christian, I have assumed this task as my own. I have embraced it even more closely since being ordained a priest, and I rejoice that my bishop, Bishop Joe Vázquez, has directly entrusted to me this same ministry to be performed here in our parish.

That is why I state the mission this way:

"In unity with our Diocesan Church of Austin, following the

guidelines issued by our bishop, we seek to **EVANGELIZE, MAKE DISCIPLES, and FORM THE CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY.**"

EVANGELIZATION seeks to provoke the encounter with a God lived and real, through the basic preaching of the Kerygma (Greek for "proclamation" and refers to the Gospel) and prayer. This will take place through initiatives of the pastoral groups and others in the parish.

MAKING DISCIPLES is, undoubtedly, the most difficult task, since it consists in making Jesus the teacher in our lives and learning from Him how to live His teaching faithfully in every area of our life. This we will aim for through a continuous catechesis. The parish seeks to be a place of growth in faith.

FORM THE CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY This goal is the natural fruit of living a personal encounter with God and seeking His kingdom in our lives. We cannot live our faith alone. Rather, we need a community where we can share our experiences and nourish ourselves with the testimony of other brothers and sisters in Christ. St. Mary Immaculate Concepción wants to be a place where faith is lived. We intentionally live this way in the Liturgical assembly, in the ministry and service groups and in our own moments of coexistence and spirituality, koinonia (Christian fellowship or communion) and mystagogy (led through the mysteries of faith).

We are a church on the move that is renewed in the love of God and guided by the prompting of the Holy Spirit.

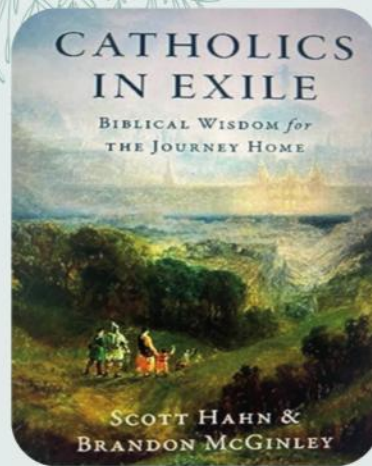

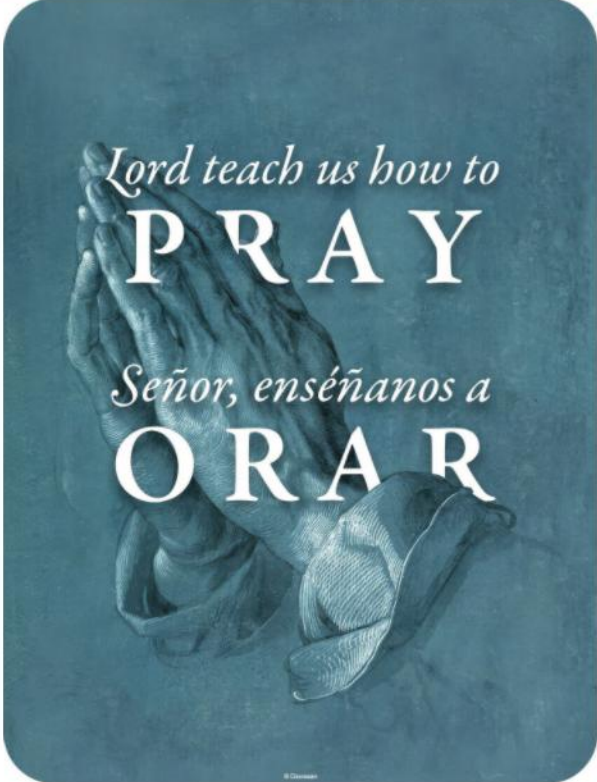
Assumption of the Virgin Mary

DEACON'S CORNER

"The Four Senses of Scripture (CCC 115-119)

Like a good cake or a delicious parfait, the Bible has many layers to it. The Church recognizes four "senses" or layers of meaning in the Scriptures. They are:

1. The Literal Sense – What did the author intend to say?

We should always start here. Scripture is not just symbolic—it's rooted in real history.

Example: "Jesus walked on the sea," → He actually walked on the sea.

2. The Allegorical Sense – How does this passage point to Christ?

The Old and New Testaments find their fulfillment in Jesus Christ.

Example: Jonah in the belly of the fish for three days points to Jesus in the tomb for three days.

3. The Moral Sense – What should I do?

The Scriptures teach us how to follow Christ. We act according to what we have read.

Example: Jesus washing feet → Serve others with humility.

4. The Anagogical Sense – What does this reveal about eternity?

This helps us see how Scripture points us to heaven and our final destiny.

Example: The Promised Land is a symbol of the heavenly kingdom.

Putting It All Together

Let's take the story of the Israelites crossing the Red Sea (Exodus 14) as an example:

- Literal: The Israelites really crossed the Red Sea after God miraculously paved the way.
- Allegorical: It foreshadows baptism – we pass from slavery to freedom.
- Moral: We must trust God in difficult moments. He can always lead us to freedom.
- Anagogical: It points to our journey to the heavenly Promised Land.

So, next time you read the Bible, try to ask:

(1) What is the story saying? (2) How does it reveal Christ? (3) How should I respond? (4) What does this teach me about heaven?

RINCON DEL DIACONO

Los Cuatro Sentidos de la Sagrada Escritura (CIC 115–119)

Como un buen pastel o un rico parfait, la Biblia tiene muchas capas. La Iglesia reconoce cuatro "sentidos" o niveles de significado en las Escrituras:

1. Sentido Literal – ¿Qué quiso decir el autor?

Siempre empezamos aquí. La Escritura no es solo simbólica: está basada en hechos reales.

Ejemplo: "Jesús caminó sobre el mar" significa que realmente caminó sobre el mar.

2. Sentido Alegórico – ¿Cómo apunta este pasaje a Cristo?

El Antiguo y el Nuevo Testamento se cumplen en Jesucristo.

Ejemplo: Jonás en el vientre del pez tres días apunta a Jesús en el sepulcro tres días.

3. Sentido Moral – ¿Qué debo hacer?

La Escritura nos enseña a seguir a Cristo. Actuamos según lo que hemos leído.

Ejemplo: Jesús lavando los pies → Servir a los demás con humildad.

4. Sentido Anagógico – ¿Qué me revela sobre la eternidad?

Nos ayuda a ver cómo la Escritura nos dirige al cielo y a nuestro destino final.

Ejemplo: La Tierra Prometida es símbolo del Reino celestial.

Poniéndolo Todo Junto

Tomemos el paso del Mar Rojo (Éxodo 14) como ejemplo:

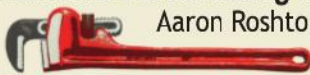
- Literal: Los israelitas cruzaron realmente el mar después de que Dios abrió el camino.
- Alegórico: Prefigura el bautismo: pasamos de la esclavitud a la libertad.
- Moral: Debemos confiar en Dios en los momentos difíciles.
- Anagógico: Señala nuestro camino hacia la Tierra Prometida del cielo.

Al leer la Biblia, pregúntate:

(1) ¿Qué dice la historia? (2) ¿Cómo revela a Cristo? (3) ¿Cómo debo responder? (4) ¿Qué me enseña sobre el cielo?
