St. Paul must have understood today's Gospel very well. Like Jesus, he knew what being a disciple would cost. It landed him in prison. Yet he seems to have no regrets; he accepts that imprisonment as part of his discipleship. Also, like Jesus, he is not afraid to ask others to take that discipleship seriously. And he is not ashamed to ask a favor: Would Philemon accept his runaway slave, Onesimus, back into his home? Not just as a slave, but as a member of his family. He shamelessly calls himself a prisoner for Christ five times in the short letter (three times in our reading). If that didn't tug Philemon's heartstrings, Paul also calls himself an old man.

In the Gospel, Jesus talks about the cost of discipleship. Paul takes that a step further; he reminds us to accept that cost freely. He could have ordered his friend to free the slave. Paul was an apostle, a leader in the early church. Instead of giving an order, he called on Philemon to respond freely to his request. Perhaps we can learn from that example.

Like Paul, when Jesus commands us to love one another, he leaves us free to accept that challenge. Remember, he always says, "Love one another, as I have loved you" (John 13:34). Jesus was never compelled to cure anyone or forgive their sins. No one ordered him to feed the hungry with loaves and fish or raise Lazarus from the dead. Yet how often do we go to church because we were told we have to? Do we volunteer for the picnic only because the pastor twists our arm? Or do we love Jesus so much that we volunteer to help without being asked? Do we love Jesus enough to invite others to follow him?

We can live life just doing what we have to. Or when Jesus offers us a new motive—love for God because God loves us—we can choose to follow him freely. In John's Gospel, there is no Agony in the Garden. He shows us that Jesus chose to obey his Father and willingly took up the cross. Let us ask the Spirit to fill us with the freedom to love.



San Pablo debió comprender muy bien el Evangelio de hoy. Al igual que Jesús, sabía lo que costaría ser discípulo. Hasta lo llevó a la cárcel. Sin embargo, parece no estar arrepentido; acepta ese encarcelamiento como parte de su discipulado. También, como Jesús, no tiene miedo de pedir a otros que tomen en serio ese discipulado. Y no le da vergüenza pedir un favor: ¿Aceptaría Filemón a su esclavo fugitivo, Onésimo, de vuelta en su casa? No solo como esclavo, sino como miembro de su familia. No le da vergüenza llamarse prisionero de Cristo cinco veces en esta breve carta (tres veces en la lectura de hoy). Si eso no conmueve a Filemón, Pablo también se llama anciano.

En el Evangelio, Jesús habla del precio del discipulado. Pablo va un paso más allá; nos recuerda que debemos aceptar ese precio libremente. Podría haberle ordenado a su amigo que liberara al esclavo. Pablo era un apóstol, un líder en la Iglesia primitiva. En lugar de darle una orden, le pidió a Filemón que respondiera libremente a su petición. Quizás podamos aprender de ese ejemplo.

Al igual que Pablo, cuando Jesús nos manda amarnos unos a otros, nos da la libertad de aceptar ese reto. Recuerden, siempre dice: “Ámense unos a los otros, como yo los he amado” (Juan 13,34). Jesús nunca se vio obligado a curar a nadie ni a perdonar sus pecados. Nadie le ordenó alimentar a los hambrientos con panes y peces ni resucitar a Lázaro. Lo hizo por amor. Sin embargo, ¿con qué frecuencia vamos a la iglesia porque nos dicen que tenemos que ir? ¿Nos ofrecemos ser voluntarios para el picnic solo porque el párroco nos suplica? ¿O amamos tanto a Jesús que nos ofrecemos a ayudar sin que nos lo pidan? ¿Amamos a Jesús lo suficiente como para invitar a otros a seguirlo?

Podemos vivir la vida simplemente haciendo lo que tenemos que hacer. O cuando Jesús nos ofrece una nueva motivación —amar a Dios porque Dios nos ama— podemos elegir seguirlo libremente. Durante su Pasión, Jesús nos mostró que eligió obedecer a su Padre y tomó voluntariamente la cruz. Pidamos al Espíritu Santo que nos llene de la libertad de amar.

DEACON'S CORNER



Have you ever felt lost? I don't mean lost on a car trip, or lost on a hike, but lost in life. Maybe there are a lot of people around you, but you still feel lost. A high school student might also feel very much lost in a very large crowd. He, she, might go from class to class, assembly to assembly and get to where he is supposed to be, but he still feels lost. When people enter the job force, it often takes them quite a while to find their place in society. Many young people are still trying to find themselves. Everyone goes through stages of life when he or she feels lost. And this does not just refer to the young. A widow or widower who is a senior citizen feels lost when his or her spouse dies. Perhaps some of us have had times that we have been lost. We go to Church every week, and that is a very good thing. But sometimes we are just going through the motions. We stand and sit and kneel and sing. The hardest times for us are often the quiet times. That is a sure sign that something is very wrong. It is hard to hide non-Christian behavior when it is only ourselves and the Lord. Those are the times when our consciences are telling us: I'm lost. Maybe, I shouldn't even be here. But we are here. We are in Church. Perhaps when we walked through the doors of the Church, we have taken the first step to see who this Jesus is. Walking through the doors of the Church is, for many, like climbing the sycamore tree to get a glimpse of Jesus. We certainly don't expect Jesus to single us out from the crowd of worshipers. But he does. He stands under the tree that every single person has climbed in his life, the tree that many of us are still looking down from, and he says, "Judy, Frank, Shirley, Bill, Zacchaeus, come down from there. I want to stay in your house tonight and from now on." Now, we are faced with what is really an easy decision: do we want Him in our house? It is going to cost us. We are going to have to abandon that which has no place in our house, in our lives. But it is an easy decision. Nothing can surpass the all-encompassing joy of having Jesus in our lives. We may have been lost in a crowd. But he searched for us and called to us. And we responded. And we have found ourselves in Jesus Christ.

RINCON DEL DIACONO

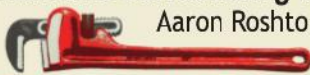
¿Alguna vez te has sentido perdido? No me refiero a perdido en un viaje en coche ni en una excursión, sino perdido en la vida. Quizás haya mucha gente a tu alrededor, pero aun así te sientes perdido. Un estudiante de secundaria también podría sentirse muy perdido en una multitud. Puede ir de clase en clase, de asamblea en asamblea y llegar a donde debería estar, pero aun así se siente perdido. Cuando las personas se incorporan al mercado laboral, a menudo les lleva bastante tiempo encontrar su lugar en la sociedad. Muchos jóvenes todavía intentan encontrarse a sí mismos. Todos pasamos por etapas en la vida en las que nos sentimos perdidos. Y esto no se refiere solo a los jóvenes. Una viuda o un viudo mayor se siente perdido cuando fallece su cónyuge. Quizás algunos de nosotros hemos tenido momentos en los que nos hemos sentido perdidos. Vamos a la iglesia todas las semanas, y eso es muy bueno. Pero a veces simplemente seguimos el ritmo. Nos ponemos de pie, nos sentamos, nos arrodillamos y cantamos. Los momentos más difíciles para nosotros suelen ser los momentos de tranquilidad. Esa es una señal inequívoca de que algo anda muy mal. Es difícil ocultar el comportamiento no cristiano cuando solo se trata de nosotros y del Señor. Esos son los momentos en que nuestra conciencia nos dice: Estoy perdido. Tal vez ni siquiera debería estar aquí. Pero estamos aquí. Estamos en la Iglesia. Quizás al cruzar las puertas de la Iglesia, damos el primer paso para ver quién es este Jesús. Cruzar las puertas de la Iglesia es, para muchos, como subirse a un sicómoro para vislumbrar a Jesús. Ciertamente no esperamos que Jesús nos distinga entre la multitud de adoradores. Pero lo hace. Se para bajo el árbol al que todos hemos subido en nuestra vida, el árbol desde el que muchos de nosotros todavía miramos hacia abajo, y dice: «Judy, Frank, Shirley, Bill, Zaqueo, bajen de ahí. Quiero quedarme en su casa esta noche y de ahora en adelante». Ahora, nos enfrentamos a una decisión realmente fácil: ¿lo queremos en nuestra casa? Nos va a costar caro. Tendremos que abandonar aquello que no tiene cabida en nuestra casa, en nuestras vidas. Pero es una decisión fácil. Nada puede superar la alegría inmensa de tener a Jesús en nuestras vidas. Puede que nos hayamos perdido entre la multitud. Pero él nos buscó y nos llamó. Y respondimos. Y nos hemos encontrado en Jesucristo.
