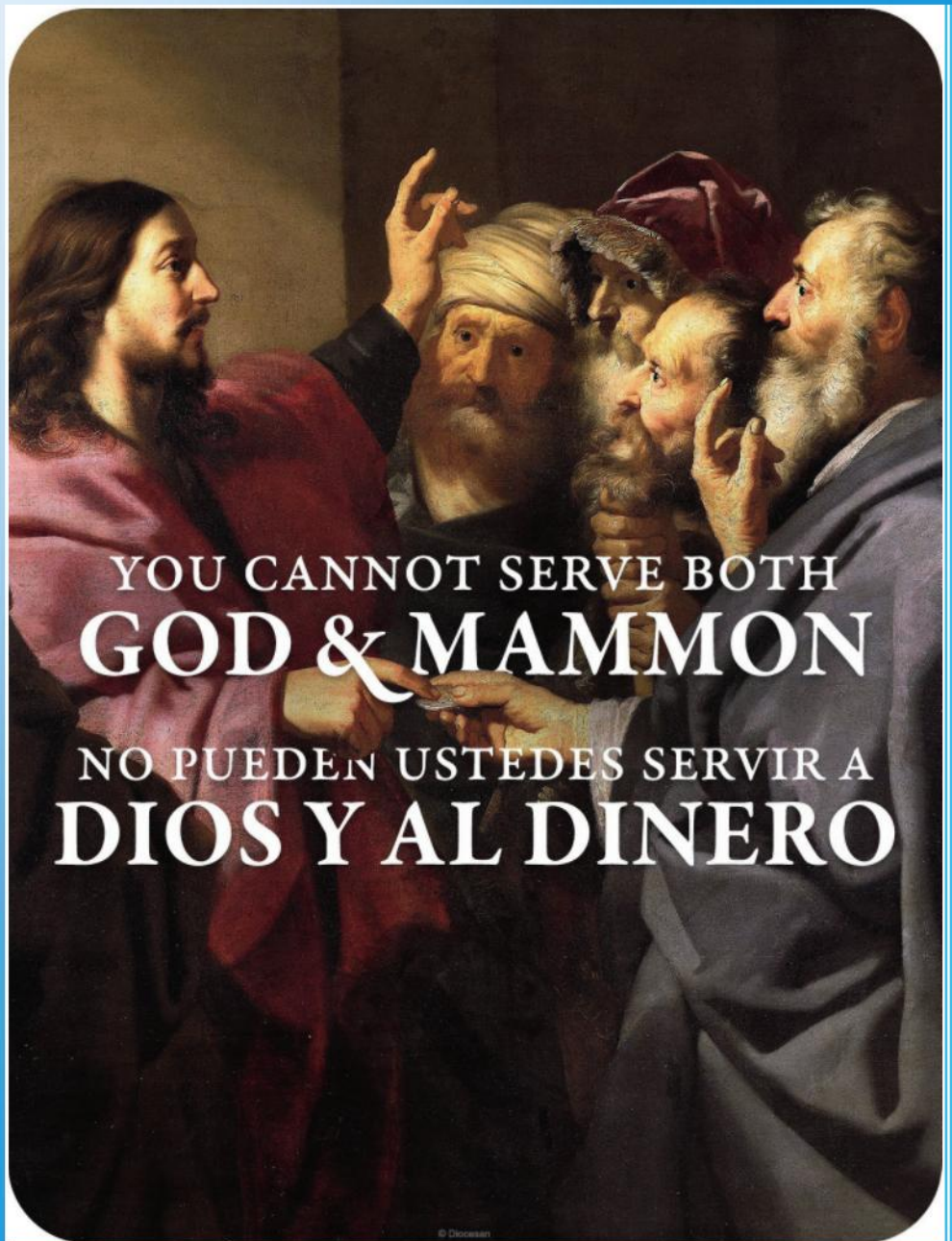

The parable in today's Gospel is another one with a surprise ending. The crooked steward is commended by his master for being prudent or clever, trying to protect himself. Jesus did not condone dishonesty. He just wanted us to be just as clever in serving the Lord. Let's look at the first two readings and how they challenge us to do more.

The reading from Amos talks about those "who trample upon the needy and destroy the poor" (Amos 8:4). The challenge here is to ask yourself, "What do I do for the poor?" If all you can think of is to throw some change in the monthly collection for the poor, you're not being very clever. Most parishes have organizations to help the needy and are happy to get volunteers. Imagine what you would do to help someone you loved who was laid off or on disability leave. Do you love Jesus enough to help the poor in his name? Do you ever think of praying for the poor? Not just a quick response to one of the Prayers of the Faithful for the homeless, but actually taking time to pray for those who are unemployed or with jobs that don't pay enough to support a family.

Speaking of prayer, our second reading also challenges us to do more. Paul recommends prayers for "kings and for all in authority" (1 Timothy 2:2). It's easy to pray for friends and family; how much time do we give to prayers for government leaders and executives? Even the leaders with whom we disagree could use more guidance from the Holy Spirit. Paul reminds us that God wants everyone to be saved (1 Timothy 2:4), sinners as well as saints, terrorists and embezzlers, atheists and agnostics. I'll bet you don't spend much time praying for the "bad guys." Yet Jesus said, "Love your enemies. Pray for those who hurt you" (Matthew 5:44). I can't say I've ever heard anyone say that was their favorite Bible passage. But if Jesus expects more from those who love him, who are we to let him down?



La parábola del Evangelio de hoy tiene un final sorprendente. El administrador deshonesto es elogiado por su amo por ser hábil, o astuto, al intentar protegerse. Jesús no aprueba la deshonestidad. Solo quiere que seamos igual de astutos al servir al Señor. Analicemos las dos primeras lecturas y cómo nos desafían a hacer más.

La lectura de Amós habla de “los que buscan al pobre sólo para arruinarlo” (Amós 8,4). El reto aquí es preguntarse: “¿Qué hago yo por los pobres?”. Si solo se te ocurre dar unas monedas en la colecta mensual para los pobres, no estás siendo muy astuto. La mayoría de las parroquias tienen organizaciones para ayudar a los necesitados y están encantadas de recibir voluntarios. Imagina lo que harías para ayudar a un ser querido que estuviera despedido o en descanso médico. ¿Amas a Jesús lo suficiente como para ayudar a los pobres en su nombre? ¿Alguna vez piensas en rezar por los pobres? No se trata solo de una respuesta rápida a una Oraciones de los Fieles por las personas sin hogar, sino de dedicar tiempo a rezar por quienes están desempleados o tienen trabajos que no pagan lo suficiente para mantener a su familia.

Hablando de la oración, la segunda lectura también nos desafía a hacer más. Pablo recomienda rezar por “por los jefes de Estado y las demás autoridades” (1 Timoteo 2,2). Es fácil orar por amigos y familiares; ¿cuánto tiempo dedicamos a rezar por los líderes y ejecutivos del gobierno? Incluso los líderes con quienes no estamos de acuerdo podrían necesitar más guía del Espíritu Santo. Pablo nos recuerda que Dios quiere la salvación de todos (1 Timoteo 2,4), tanto pecadores como santos, terroristas y malversadores, ateos y agnósticos. Supongo que la mayoría de nosotros no dedicamos mucho tiempo a rezar por los “malos”. Sin embargo, Jesús dijo: “Amen a sus enemigos. Oren por quienes los lastiman” (Mateo 5,44). No creo que haya escuchado a nadie decir que ese era su pasaje bíblico favorito, pero si Jesús espera más de quienes lo aman, ¿quiénes somos nosotros para defraudarlo?

Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events

Saint Mary's Catholic Church will be sponsoring a Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (CRASE) course on Saturday September 27 at 8:00 AM in the Parish Activity Center. The course is open to all interested individuals.

The CRASE course is designed to provide strategies, guidance, and a proven plan for surviving an active shooter event. It is built on the "Avoid, Deny, Defend" (ADD) strategy developed by ALERRT in 2004. Topics covered include the history and prevalence of active shooter events, civilian response options, medical issues, and considerations for conducting drills.

This course is being held under the direction of parishioner Craig Goodman, Chief of the Waco ISD Police Department.

DEACON'S CORNER

I enjoy reading Paul's letter to the Philippians. He knows how to live in poverty and how to enjoy abundance. He knows joy. He knows suffering. He also knows that he is not alone. He tells them that he can do all things in Him who strengthens him. And so can we. Our lives have a great deal in common with Paul's life.

There are times that we have joined with what the mob says is right. We have stood with Saul of Tarsus as St. Stephen was stoned. We kept quiet as people at work, or school, or in the neighborhood, perhaps even family members verbally attacked our Catholic Faith. In that way we participated in the stoning of Christianity. Or, perhaps, we let ourselves go, chose immorality, and then mocked those who were trying to live a decent life. "Oh, so you are going to wait until after marriage. Isn't that cute." Perhaps we heard a voice telling us to follow, and we ran the other way. Still, God does not give up on us. Sometimes he allows life to knock us to the ground, but then He calls us out of blindness into His Light. Maybe we suddenly realized that the main problem of our lives was within us, not around us. We call upon the Lord to heal us and guide us. Then we trust in Him, we trust Him to such a degree that we proclaim with Paul, "I can do all things in Him who strengthens me."

What are we really called to do in life? What are our lives really about? The challenges of life, tension in our family, or your marriages, difficulties in school, or work, or lack of work, difficulties with friends and those who do not want our friendship, all those things that really irritate us; none of these are what life is about. Life is about Jesus Christ. Life is about proclaiming His Presence to a world that longs for Him. I can do this. We can do this. No matter what difficulties we might have, no matter what challenges we may need to overcome; we can do this. Here is what matters: Jesus Christ is what matters, or, more correctly, He is the One who matters. We can live His Life and thereby have purpose in our lives. We can do this because He gives us His Life. We can do all things in Him who strengthens us. Jesus took a man named Saul, a man who murdered Jesus' first followers, and transformed Saul into Paul, the great apostle of the early Church. The Lord transforms each of us. He takes each of us, with all our humanity, with all our weakness, and He uses us to make Him present for others. There is nothing that matters that we cannot do with Him.

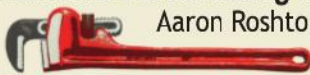

Les dice que todo lo puede en Aquel que lo fortalece. Y nosotros también. Nuestras vidas tienen mucho en común con la de Pablo. Hay momentos en que nos hemos unido a lo que la multitud considera correcto. Hemos apoyado a Saulo de Tarso mientras apedreaban a San Esteban. Nos quedamos callados mientras la gente en el trabajo, la escuela o en el vecindario, tal vez incluso familiares, atacaban verbalmente nuestra fe católica. De esa manera, participamos en la lapidación del cristianismo. O, tal vez, nos dejamos llevar, optamos por la inmoralidad y luego nos burlamos de quienes intentaban vivir una vida decente. "Ah, entonces vas a esperar hasta después del matrimonio. ¡Qué tierno!". Quizás oímos una voz que nos decía que lo siguiéramos y corrimos en dirección contraria. Aun así, Dios no nos abandona. A veces permite que la vida nos derribe, pero luego nos llama de nuestra ceguera a su Luz. Quizás de repente nos dimos cuenta de que el principal problema de nuestras vidas estaba dentro de nosotros, no a nuestro alrededor. Clamamos al Señor para que nos sane y nos guíe. Entonces confiamos en Él, confiamos en Él hasta tal punto que proclamamos con Pablo: «Todo lo puedo en Cristo que me fortalece».

¿A qué estamos realmente llamados en la vida? ¿De qué se trata realmente nuestra vida? Los desafíos de la vida, la tensión en nuestra familia o en nuestros matrimonios, las dificultades en la escuela, el trabajo o la falta de trabajo, las dificultades con los amigos y con quienes no quieren nuestra amistad, todas esas cosas que realmente nos irritan; nada de esto es lo que significa la vida. La vida se trata de Jesucristo. La vida se trata de proclamar su presencia a un mundo que lo anhela. Puedo hacerlo. Nosotros podemos hacerlo. No importan las dificultades que tengamos, no importan los desafíos que tengamos que superar; podemos hacerlo. Esto es lo que importa: Jesucristo es lo que importa, o, más correctamente, Él es quien importa. Podemos vivir Su Vida y, por lo tanto, tener un propósito en nuestras vidas. Podemos hacerlo porque Él nos da Su Vida. Todo lo podemos en Él, quien nos fortalece. Jesús tomó a un hombre llamado Saulo, quien asesinó a sus primeros seguidores, y lo transformó en Pablo, el gran apóstol de la Iglesia primitiva. El Señor nos transforma a cada uno. Nos toma a cada uno, con toda nuestra humanidad, con todas nuestras debilidades, y nos usa para hacerlo presente para los demás. No hay nada importante que no podamos hacer con Él.
