I have to admit, every time we come across a feast day for the dedication of a church, I am tempted to tune out and yawn. I mean what's all the fuss about buildings? Doesn't the Bible tell us over and over again not to focus on the external, the material and the riches of this world? Aren't we supposed to be all about forming hearts and saving souls, about the Church rather than a church?

Well, if the Church has proclaimed this day a feast, then it must have some great significance, so let's find it. The Archbasilica of St. John Lateran in Rome is the cathedral of the Bishop of Rome. In other words, St. Peter's in Vatican City is not the Pope's home church. His cathedra, his bishop's seat, is found at St. John Lateran. This basilica was built on terrain donated by Emperor Constantine himself and celebrated the freedom of worship granted by the Edict of Milan. Wow.

Ok, so maybe this isn't just any old church. Originally this feast was only celebrated in Rome, but in 1726, it was placed on the worldwide calendar. This building holds special significance, reminding Catholics of the courage of the early Christians who fought for freedom of religion and the unity of the universal Church with the Holy See.

Bringing it a little closer to home, this feast could also be a reminder to us of the respect due our own parish church. Do we see it as a place of honor, reverence and community worship? Do we dress, act and keep silence in an appropriate way, considering we are in the physical presence of Almighty God? Do we offer ourselves together with Christ in the Eucharistic sacrifice, uniting ourselves with Catholics throughout the world?

May we celebrate our universal Church today and may we thank God for all of the churches that have been built and dedicated to allow us a space to worship freely. Maybe we should make a fuss about these beautiful buildings after all.



Debo admitir que, cada vez que nos encontramos con un día festivo para la dedicación de una iglesia, siento la tentación de no prestar atención y bostezar. Es decir, ¿por qué tanto alboroto por los edificios? ¿Acaso la Biblia no nos dice una y otra vez que no nos centremos en lo externo, lo material y las riquezas de este mundo? ¿No se supone que deberíamos dedicarnos a formar corazones y salvar almas, a la Iglesia en lugar de a una iglesia?

Bueno, si la Iglesia ha proclamado este día como fiesta, entonces debe tener un gran significado, así que busquémoslo. La Archibasílica de San Juan de Letrán en Roma es la catedral del Obispo de Roma. En otras palabras, San Pedro en la Ciudad del Vaticano no es la iglesia natal del Papa. Su cátedra, su sede episcopal, se encuentra en San Juan de Letrán. Esta basílica se construyó en un terreno donado por el propio emperador Constantino y celebraba la libertad de culto otorgada por el Edicto de Milán. ¡Qué increíble!

Bueno, entonces quizá no se trate de una iglesia cualquiera. Originalmente, esta fiesta sólo se celebraba en Roma, pero en 1726 se incorporó al calendario mundial. Este edificio tiene un significado especial, recordando a los católicos la valentía de los primeros cristianos que lucharon por la libertad religiosa y la unidad de la Iglesia universal con la Santa Sede.

En un contexto más cercano, esta fiesta también podría ser un recordatorio del respeto que se debe a nuestra parroquia. ¿La consideramos un lugar de honor, reverencia y culto comunitario? ¿Nos vestimos, actuamos y guardamos silencio de forma apropiada, considerando que estamos en la presencia física de Dios Todopoderoso? ¿Nos ofrecemos junto con Cristo en el sacrificio eucarístico, uniéndonos a los católicos de todo el mundo?

Celebremos hoy nuestra Iglesia universal y demos gracias a Dios por todas las iglesias que se han construido y dedicado para brindarnos un espacio de culto libre. Tal vez debería haber mucho alboroto por estos hermosos edificios después de todo.

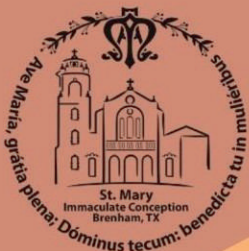

DEACON'S CORNER

If I asked you what is the premier Church in Christendom what would you say? Perhaps St. Peter's Basilica in Vatican City or the basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City or even the basilica in Fatima Portugal where the Mother of God appeared in 1917.

Today we celebrate the Lateran Church in Rome, the episcopal seat of the Pope and the Rome's Cathedral Church known as the "the mother and head of all the churches in Rome" the only archbasilica in the world. It is outside Vatican City and is the chief basilica and the highest-ranking Church in Rome. It was the pope's residence from the 4th century until 1309. It was the site of five ecumenical councils. The current structure was commissioned in 1646. Beneath its high altar rests the remains of a small table on which tradition says St. Peter celebrated mass dedicated to the savior and later to St. John the Baptist. (Ordo Paulist Press)

Today our readings talk about other temples. In the Gospel Jesus drives the money changers and those selling sacrificial animals for Jewish rituals out of the Jerusalem temple telling the Jewish leaders to not make His Father's house a market place. All four Gospels refer to this event. When the Jewish leaders ask Jesus on what sign he can provide for doing this Jesus replies destroy this temple and will raise it up in three days! Jesus is claiming to be the true temple. The leaders don't understand that Jesus is referring to His body which he will raise on the third day after his crucifixion.

Jesus' cleansing of the temple is a prophetic sign that the Jerusalem Temple's imminent destruction by the Romans in 70 AD. The first reading talks about water flowing from the side of a temple. This should remind us of the water flowing from the side of the crucified Jesus and the river of life in the New Jerusalem (Rev. 22:1). Our second reading says that we are God's Temple. As members of His body you and I are God's temple where the Holy Spirit dwells within. We are part of the what The Book of Revelation 21:22 calls the New Jerusalem, the true Temple of Almighty God and The Lamb.

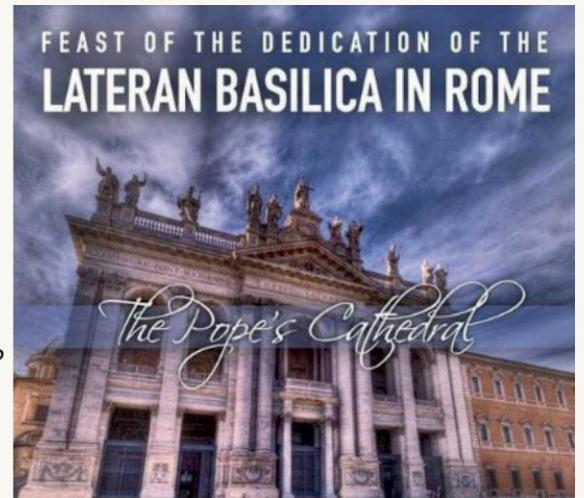
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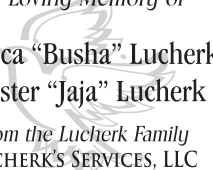
Si les preguntara cuál es la iglesia principal de la cristiandad, ¿qué dirían? Quizás la Basílica de San Pedro en la Ciudad del Vaticano, o la Basílica de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe en la Ciudad de México, o incluso la basílica de Fátima en Portugal, donde la Madre de Dios se apareció en 1917.

Hoy celebramos la Basílica de San Juan de Letrán en Roma, sede episcopal del Papa y catedral de Roma, conocida como "la madre y cabeza de todas las iglesias de Roma", la única archibasílica del mundo. Se encuentra fuera de la Ciudad del Vaticano y es la basílica principal y la iglesia de mayor rango en Roma. Fue la residencia del Papa desde el siglo IV hasta 1309. Fue sede de cinco concilios ecuménicos. La estructura actual fue encargada en 1646. Debajo de su altar mayor reposan los restos de una pequeña mesa sobre la cual, según la tradición, San Pedro celebró misa dedicada al Salvador y posteriormente a San Juan Bautista. (Ordo Paulist Press)

Hoy nuestras lecturas hablan de otros templos. En el Evangelio, Jesús expulsa a los cambistas y a los que vendían animales para los sacrificios judíos del templo de Jerusalén, diciéndoles a los líderes judíos que no conviertan la casa de su Padre en un mercado. Los cuatro Evangelios se refieren a este acontecimiento. Cuando los líderes judíos le preguntan a Jesús qué señal puede dar para justificar esto, Jesús responde: ¡Destruyan este templo y lo reconstruiré en tres días! Jesús afirma ser el verdadero templo. Los líderes no entienden que Jesús se refiere a su cuerpo, que resucitará al tercer día después de su crucifixión. La purificación del templo por parte de Jesús es un signo profético de la inminente destrucción del Templo de Jerusalén por los romanos en el año 70 d.C. La primera lectura habla del agua que fluye del costado de un templo. Esto nos recuerda el agua que fluyó del costado de Jesús crucificado y el río de la vida en la Nueva Jerusalén (Apocalipsis 22:1). Nuestra segunda lectura dice que somos el Templo de Dios. Como miembros de su cuerpo, ustedes y yo somos el templo de Dios, donde habita el Espíritu Santo. Somos parte de lo que el Libro del Apocalipsis 21:22 llama la Nueva Jerusalén, el verdadero Templo de Dios Todopoderoso y del Cordero.
