The reading from the prophet Isaiah this Sunday contains a remarkable prediction—the end of war between nations (Isaiah 2:4). While most of the good predictions of the prophets were fulfilled in Jesus, we still await the end of all wars. So why hasn't that one been fulfilled? We can look to the second reading and the Gospel for some hints.

Both readings talk about being awake and ready for our salvation (Romans 13:12) or the coming of the Son of Man (Matthew 24:39). Being awake doesn't mean consuming lots of coffee or turning the music volume all the way up. Paul calls it "putting on the Lord Jesus Christ" as a soldier would put on armor before a battle. He even mentions rivalry and jealousy as attitudes to avoid. Both of those vices have been the cause of many wars in our history. What if we not only avoided them, but also taught our children to avoid them? What if everyone eventually learned not to be jealous and hateful?

We are a long way from ending all wars. There are still people who teach hate to the poor instead of helping to feed them. There are still people who get rich selling the weapons of war. This brings us back to the first reading, in which Isaiah speaks of beating swords into plowshares. Do we have enough faith in God's love to stop building weapons and use those resources to feed the hungry or cure diseases in underprivileged countries? Until we convert everyone to following Jesus, that's not likely. The Gospel calls us to be ready. Maybe we need to be ready to share our faith. Maybe we have to be awake to any opportunity to show God's love to those around us. Are we afraid to offer to pray for someone in need? Maybe we need to put on the "armor of light," as St. Paul calls it. Instead of trying to stop all wars, could we at least show forgiveness to someone who has hurt us?

Jesus never said to do the impossible. If we can be ready to see Jesus in those around us, to show his love to those who need it, or just be patient with other people's faults and weaknesses, we may not stop all wars, but we will be prepared for the coming of the Prince of Peace.



La primera lectura del profeta Isaías contiene una predicción notable: el fin de las guerras entre las naciones (Isaías 2,4). Si bien la mayoría de las buenas predicciones de los profetas se cumplieron en Jesús, aún esperamos el fin de todas las guerras. Entonces, ¿por qué esa no se ha cumplido? Podemos consultar la segunda lectura y el Evangelio para obtener algunas pistas.

Ambas lecturas hablan de estar despiertos y preparados para nuestra salvación (Romanos 13,12) o para la venida del Hijo del Hombre (Mateo 24,39). Estar despierto no significa tomar mucho café ni subir el volumen de la música al máximo. Pablo dice: "Revístanse más bien, de nuestro Señor Jesucristo" como un soldado se pondría la armadura antes de una batalla. Incluso menciona la rivalidad y los celos como actitudes que debemos evitar. Ambos vicios han sido la causa de muchas guerras en nuestra historia. ¿Qué pasaría si no solo los evitáramos, sino que también enseñáramos a nuestros hijos a evitarlos? ¿Qué pasaría si todos aprendiéramos a no ser celosos ni odiosos?

Estamos muy lejos de acabar con todas las guerras. Todavía hay quienes inculcan el odio a los pobres en lugar de alimentarlos. Todavía hay quienes se enriquecen vendiendo armas de guerra. Esto nos lleva de vuelta a la primera lectura, donde Isaías habla de convertir las espadas en arados. ¿Tenemos suficiente fe en el amor de Dios para dejar de fabricar armas y usar esos recursos para alimentar a los hambrientos o curar enfermedades en países desfavorecidos? Hasta que no convirtamos a todos a seguir a Jesús, eso no es probable. El Evangelio nos llama a estar preparados. Tal vez debamos estar dispuestos a compartir nuestra fe. Tal vez debamos estar atentos a cualquier oportunidad para mostrar el amor de Dios a quienes nos rodean. ¿Nos da miedo ofrecernos a orar por alguien necesitado? Tal vez debamos ponernos las "armas de la luz", como la llama San Pablo. En lugar de intentar detener todas las guerras, ¿podríamos al menos perdonar a quien nos ha hecho daño?

Jesús nunca dijo que hiciéramos lo imposible. Si podemos estar dispuestos a ver a Jesús en quienes nos rodean, a mostrar su amor a quienes lo necesitan, o simplemente ser pacientes con las faltas y debilidades de los demás, quizá no detengamos todas las guerras, pero estaremos preparados para la venida del Príncipe de la Paz.

DEACON'S CORNER

Have you ever wondered how priests and deacons keep track of all the different aspects of our liturgies for every day of the year? For example, what the readings are, what color vestments to wear, which mass texts to use, when the solemnities, feasts and memorials and various liturgical seasons occur and what are the readings and prayers in the Liturgy of the Hours?

While we find some of these things in the missal and the Lectionary (contains all readings). There is another book we use called the ORDO, i.e., the Order of Prayer in the Liturgy of the Hours and Celebration of the Eucharist. Today we begin the season of Advent for year A. This is what the ORDO says. Advent has a two-fold character, for it is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time.

As the Ordo says today is a time of preparation for the coming of the Lord at Christmas. One of the prefaces for Advent says: *...the prophets foretold him, the Virgin Mother longed for him with love beyond all telling, John the Baptist sang of his coming and proclaimed his presence when he came. It is by this gift that already we rejoice at the mystery of his Nativity, that he may find us watchful in prayer and exultant in his praise.*

Today the Paul's Letter to the Romans and the Gospel tell us to be ready for the coming of the Lord. The Gospel says *...you do not know when the Lord will come....you must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect the Son of Man will come.*

What can we do to prepare the way of the Lord His coming? Perhaps in imitation of the Blessed Mother and with her assistance we can long for Him beyond all telling? **May you have a blessed Advent Season.**

RINCON DEL DIACONO

¿Alguna vez te has preguntado cómo los sacerdotes y diáconos llevan la cuenta de todos los aspectos de nuestras liturgias para cada día del año? Por ejemplo, ¿cuáles son las lecturas, qué color de vestimentas usar, qué textos litúrgicos emplear, cuándo se celebran las solemnidades, fiestas, memorias y los distintos tiempos litúrgicos, y cuáles son las lecturas y oraciones de la Liturgia de las Horas?

Si bien encontramos algunas de estas cosas en el misal y el Leccionario (que contiene todas las lecturas), hay otro libro que utilizamos llamado ORDO, es decir, el Orden de la Oración en la Liturgia de las Horas y la Celebración de la Eucaristía. Hoy comenzamos el tiempo de Adviento del año A. Esto es lo que dice el ORDO. El Adviento tiene un doble carácter: es tiempo de preparación para las solemnidades de Navidad, en las que se recuerda la Primera Venida del Hijo de Dios a la humanidad, y también tiempo en el que, al recordarla, las mentes y los corazones se preparan para la Segunda Venida de Cristo al final de los tiempos.

Como dice el Ordo, hoy es tiempo de preparación para la venida del Señor en Navidad. Uno de los prefacios del Adviento dice: «...los profetas lo anunciaron, la Virgen María lo anheló con un amor indescriptible, Juan el Bautista cantó su venida y proclamó su presencia cuando llegó. Es por este don que ya nos regocijamos en el misterio de su Natividad, para que nos encuentre vigilantes en la oración y exultantes en su alabanza».

Hoy, la Carta de Pablo a los Romanos y el Evangelio nos exhortan a estar preparados para la venida del Señor. El Evangelio dice: «...no sabéis cuándo vendrá el Señor... debéis estar preparados, porque a la hora menos pensada vendrá el Hijo del Hombre».

*¿Qué podemos hacer para preparar el camino del Señor para su venida? Quizás, imitando a la Santísima Virgen y con su ayuda, podamos anhelarlo con una intensidad inmensa. **Que tengan un bendecido Adviento.***
