



FAQ's about Lent cont...



Why do we say that there are forty days of Lent? When you count all the days from Ash Wednesday through Holy Saturday, there are 46.

It might be more accurate to say that there is the "forty day fast within Lent." Historically, Lent has varied from a week to three weeks to the present configuration of 46 days. The forty day fast, however, has been more stable. The Sundays of Lent are certainly part of the Time of Lent, but they are not prescribed days of fast and abstinence.

So does that mean that when we give something up for Lent, such as candy, we can have it on Sundays?

Apart from the prescribed days of fast and abstinence on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, and the days of abstinence every Friday of Lent, Catholics have traditionally chosen additional penitential practices for the whole Time of Lent. These practices are disciplinary in nature and often more effective if they are continuous, i.e., kept on Sundays as well. That being said, such practices are not regulated by the Church, but by individual conscience..

I understand that all the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat, but I'm not sure what is classified as meat. Does meat include chicken and dairy products?

Abstinence laws consider that meat comes only from animals such as chickens, cows, sheep or pigs --- all of which live on land. Birds are also considered meat. Abstinence does not include meat juices and liquid foods made from meat. Thus, such foods as chicken broth, consomme, soups cooked or flavored with meat, meat gravies or sauces, as well as seasonings or condiments made from animal fat are technically not forbidden. However, moral theologians have traditionally taught that we should abstain from all animal-derived products (except foods such as gelatin, butter, cheese and eggs, which do not have any meat taste). Fish are a different category of animal. Salt and freshwater species of fish, amphibians, reptiles, (cold-blooded animals) and shellfish are permitted.

Preguntas frecuentes sobre la Cuaresma

¿Por qué decimos que hay cuarenta días de Cuaresma? Si contamos todos los días desde el Miércoles de Ceniza hasta el Sábado Santo, son 46.

Quizás sea más preciso decir que existe el "ayuno de cuarenta días dentro de la Cuaresma". Históricamente, la Cuaresma ha variado de una a tres semanas hasta la configuración actual de 46 días. Sin embargo, el ayuno de cuarenta días ha sido más estable. Los domingos de Cuaresma ciertamente forman parte del Tiempo de Cuaresma, pero no son días prescritos de ayuno y abstinencia.

¿Significa esto que cuando renunciamos a algo durante la Cuaresma, como dulces, podemos comerlo los domingos?

Además de los días prescritos de ayuno y abstinencia del Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo, y los días de abstinencia de cada viernes de Cuaresma, los católicos tradicionalmente han optado por prácticas penitenciales adicionales durante todo el Tiempo de Cuaresma. Estas prácticas son de naturaleza disciplinaria y, a menudo, más efectivas si son continuas, es decir, se mantienen también los domingos. Dicho esto, estas prácticas no están reguladas por la Iglesia, sino por la conciencia individual.

Entiendo que todos los viernes de Cuaresma son días de abstinencia de carne, pero no estoy seguro de qué se clasifica como carne. ¿Incluye la carne el pollo y los productos lácteos?

Las leyes de abstinencia consideran que la carne proviene únicamente de animales como pollos, vacas, ovejas o cerdos, todos los cuales viven en la tierra. Las aves también se consideran carne. La abstinencia no incluye los jugos ni los líquidos de la carne. Por lo tanto, alimentos como el caldo de pollo, el consomé, las sopas cocinadas o condimentadas con carne, las salsas o jugos de carne, así como los condimentos o aderezos hechos con grasa animal, técnicamente no están prohibidos. Sin embargo, los teólogos morales han enseñado tradicionalmente que debemos abstenernos de todos los productos de origen animal (excepto alimentos como la gelatina, la mantequilla, el queso y los huevos, que no tienen sabor a carne). El pescado es una categoría diferente de animal. Se permiten especies de peces, anfibios, reptiles (animales de sangre fría) y mariscos, tanto de agua salada como dulce.

DEACON'S CORNER

What I want to concentrate on today is this: what the Man Born Blind experienced as he grew in faith, the opposition he received, is the same as what we experience as we grow in faith. We will always be confronted with those who do not have faith and who want to convince us to give up our faith. Perhaps, you have already received some of this opposition. At school, at work, in the neighborhood someone may say to you, "You're Catholic? OH! You don't really believe all that stuff, do you?" Or they may come out with the old anti-Catholic bigotry such as, "You guys never read the bible," or "You guys worship Mary making her a goddess," or make statements about the Eucharist that are so blasphemous that I it pains me to repeat them. Or maybe you may come upon people who are not just anti-Catholic, but anti-Christian, or anti-God. They may challenge those areas of our faith that cannot be explained, but can only be believed, such as the Trinity, or Jesus as both God and man. Then there are those who belittle us because they oppose our ways of living the Christian life, our morality, those actions we are convinced are right or wrong. Why? Why do people have such opposition to our faith? Probably for a lot of reasons. One of them might be envy; they wish they could be part of a strong Church group, but instead of coming and joining one, they try to destroy those who do come. But we are not blind. We can see. We know how happy we are when we are with Jesus. Think about those first times that you held you babies, and how you felt more love welling up in you than ever thought possible. Think about how you talked to God about the wonder of life you held in your arms. We know where happiness can be found. We are growing in our faith because we want to perfect our vision until we see God face to face in heaven. Do you know what they call this meeting with God in heaven? They call this the Beatific Vision. Do not allow anti Catholic or anti Christian or anti-Theist, or immoral people destroy your vision of the Lord. You and I need to put up a fight, a fight for the light that brings happiness. At the beginning of today's Gospel Jesus exclaimed, "I am the Light of the World." We pray today that we might allow the Light of Christ to grow within us and glow from us. For it is only our union with Christ that will dispel the darkness of the world.

RINCON DEL DIACONO

Hoy quiero centrarme en esto: lo que experimentó el Ciego de Nacimiento al crecer en la fe, la oposición que recibió, es la misma que experimentamos nosotros al crecer en ella. Siempre nos enfrentaremos a quienes no tienen fe y quieren convencernos de que la abandonemos. Quizás ya hayas recibido algo de esta oposición. En la escuela, en el trabajo, en el barrio, alguien podría decirte: "¿Eres católico? ¡Ay! ¿De verdad crees en todo eso?". Pueden cuestionar aspectos de nuestra fe que no se pueden explicar, sino que solo se pueden creer, como la Trinidad o Jesús como Dios y hombre. Luego están quienes nos menosprecian porque se oponen a nuestra forma de vivir la vida cristiana, a nuestra moralidad, a las acciones que estamos convencidos de que son correctas o incorrectas. ¿Por qué? ¿Por qué la gente se opone tanto a nuestra fe? Probablemente por muchas razones. Una de ellas podría ser la envidia; desearían formar parte de una iglesia fuerte, pero en lugar de unirse a una, intentan destruir a quienes sí asisten. Pero no estamos ciegos. Podemos ver. Sabemos lo felices que somos cuando estamos con Jesús. Piensa en esas primeras veces que sostuviste a tus bebés y cómo sentiste que brotaba en ti más amor del que jamás imaginaste. Piensa en cómo le hablaste a Dios sobre la maravilla de la vida que sostenías en tus brazos. Sabemos dónde se puede encontrar la felicidad. Estamos creciendo en nuestra fe porque queremos perfeccionar nuestra visión hasta ver a Dios cara a cara en el cielo. ¿Sabes cómo se llama a este encuentro con Dios en el cielo? Se llama la Visión Beatífica. No permitas que personas anticatólicas, anticristianas, antiteístas o inmorales destruyan tu visión del Señor. 
